


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

# Montgomery, Texas



#### **Number of farms**

1,701 farms in 2002, 1,495 farms in 1997, up 14 percent.

#### Land in farms

197,892 acres in 2002, 206,100 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### Average size of farm

116 acres in 2002, 138 acres in 1997, down 16 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$20,069,000 in 2002, \$16,568,000 in 1997, up 21 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$11,547,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$8,522,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$11,798 in 2002, \$11,082 in 1997, up 6 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
