

557,102 acres in 2002, 512,861 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

#### Average size of farm

2,211 acres in 2002, 1,899 acres in 1997, up 16 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$15,051,000 in 2002, \$11,042,000 in 1997, up 36 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,267,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$13,783,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$59,725 in 2002, \$40,896 in 1997, up 46 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
