


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

606 farms in 2002, 666 farms in 1997, down 9 percent.

301,574 acres in 2002, 342,093 acres in 1997, down 12 percent.

### Average size of farm

498 acres in 2002, 514 acres in 1997, down 3 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$15,829,000 in 2002, \$22,294,000 in 1997, down 29 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$8,135,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$7,694,000 of the total value in 2002.

## Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$26,121 in 2002, \$33,474 in 1997, down 22 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
