

- NEW FOLSOM DAM PROGRAM -

This notice is to inform you of recent changes with tours at Folsom Dam. Due to increased security guidelines and numerous construction projects at the dam and powerplant, dam tours have been suspended indefinitely.

However, the programs at the newly relocated and updated American River Water Education Center will continue. In addition we have added a new program about Folsom Dam. (See page 2) The new tours will be presented in the near by Beals Point Park and will incorporate the same information as past tours in a fast-paced, fun and interesting way. Other tour options are also being explored.

Folsom Dam has been identified as one of the top ten high risk threats to our country's infrastructure. For this reason, heightened security policy now does not allow visitors or any unnecessary personnel to access areas that the tour route once followed. A variety of construction projects including the new bridge to east Folsom, the auxiliary spillway, reinforcement of the wing dams and future work projects in the powerplant will also prevent us from safely visiting other areas. The safety of all and the security of the dam is the priority. We hope this will not stop you from experiencing our new Center and tour.

Folsom Dam has a long history of public education and involvement with the community and we hope that at some point in the future dam tours will be possible.
