

The Public Right to Know

We the undersigned find the F.D.A.'s current policy regarding genetically engineered foods to be inadequate in ensuring the safety of the public's food. New gene splicing technology is fundamentally different from tradition plant breeding and hybridization, with many potentially unexpected and very dangerous consequences for humans, animals and the ecology of the planet.

The public has a right to know what foods have been genetically tampered.

We believe that the F.D.A. as the primary federal agency responsible for ensuring the safety of commercial food, must regulate this new industry by requiring:

- **Mandatory** labeling by the industry of the entire contents of all genetically engineered foods at all levels of production, distribution and sale.

- **Mandatory** pre-market safety testing of all genetically engineered foods.

- **Mandatory** pre-market registration with the F.D.A. by manufacturers of all genetically engineered foods, so that the foods can be tracked if illnesses or other problems arise.

- At least, if these new products are found to be a health hazard, we expect the F.D.A. to ban them from the public food supply.

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
