The Cosmetic, Toiletry and Fragrance Association, Inc., whose members manufacture more than 85% of the cosmetics made in the United States, has alerted its members to this request and has, on June 3rd and June 20th, disseminated copies of analytical methods for analysis of Vinyl Chloride Monomer provided by individual companies.

We are certain that CTFA members will require additional time to evaluate these methods before they can prepare submissions.
