

Continued Support of Louisiana Recovery FEMA Public Assistance Weekly Update

Over \$480K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to Cameron Parish School Board for the replacement of the main building at Cameron Elementary School.

Over \$84K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to the Recovery School District for the repair of William Frantz Elementary School (cafeteria bldg.), Andrew Bell Junior High School (Admin. bldg. and Bldg. E). Funding was also obligated for mold remediation and repair of Bldg. B at Bienville Elementary School.

Over \$280K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to the Regional Transit Authority for the restoration of the dissolved air floatation unit at the Canal Street Water Treatment System.

Nearly \$136K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to The Housing Authority of New Orleans for the stabilization and securing of units located in Christopher Park.

Nearly \$334K in Public Assistance funding was obligated to The Preschool Learning Center, Inc. for temporary relocation.
