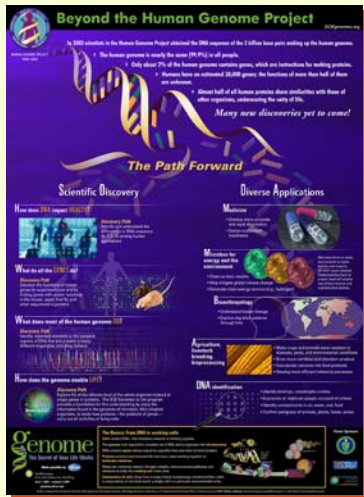


ORNL Genome Management Information System (GMIS) Wins Eight Publication Awards
