# **Post 10 Screening**

Post 10 is located on East Jemez Rd. near NM 4.

#### Vehicles Required to Stop at Post 10

Non-government-owned commercial delivery vehicles desiring access beyond the VAPs to Laboratory property, Jemez Springs, ski basin, etc., must present a Post 10 vehicle inspection pass. Inspection is required even if the driver possesses a standard DOE/LANL security badge

## Vehicles Not Required to Stop at Post 10

- Badged (i.e., valid DOE/LANL issued security badge) persons driving government-owned delivery vehicles with U.S. Government license plates
- Commercial delivery vehicles not desiring access beyond the VAPs

# **Enforcement of Access Requirements**

The following actions will result in a response by Protective Force officers:

- Failure to follow access requirements
- Failure to stop at VAPs
- Attempt to bypass VAPs
- Failure to follow direction of Protective Force officers

# **Safety Reminder**

Approach the VAPs with caution. Think ahead and be courteous to fellow drivers. Allow enough time for lane changes, allow others to get into lanes they need to, and merge correctly. Follow the verbal or hand signal directions of the Protective Force officers.

# **Security Perimeter**

Operating in early January 2007

The Security Perimeter is intended to enhance the perimeter of the Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) in order to protect against the possibility of terrorist attacks. Access will be controlled by Vehicle Access Portals (VAPs) located at:

- East Jemez Rd. (near southeast corner of Diamond Dr. and Jemez Rd.)
- West Jemez Rd. (near the Camp May Rd. and Jemez Rd. intersection)
- Pajarito Rd. (at NM 4)

Access requirements for VAPs at East and West Jemez Rd. will differ from those for Pajarito Rd. Access requirements provided in this brochure are for East and West Jemez Rd. VAPs only.

## **Vehicle Access Portals**

VAPs will allow or restrict access according to Security Condition (SECON) levels. At least one booth at the VAP will be staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During peak traffic periods additional booths will be staffed. Lighted signs on each booth will indicate whether it is opened or closed:

#### Open





#### Closed



There may be occasions when VAPs will be required to stop vehicle processing. Follow directions of the Protective Force officer during an emergency shutdown.

## **Access Requirements**

Access requirements for East and West Jemez VAPs only. Normal operating level is SECON 3+.

Vehicles & Motorcycles	No ID check. Stop momentarily Wait for Protective Force officer signal to proceed.
LANL Bus Services	No ID check. Stop momentarily.
Park & Ride Bus	Bus driver will use special access road.
Large Commercial Delivery Trucks	No ID check. Present Post 10 vehicle inspection pass.
Bicycles	No ID check. No stop.
Pedestrians	Not required to process through the VAP.
RVs and Motorhomes	No ID check. Stop for vehicle check.
Emergency Vehicles	No ID check, stop momentarily and wait for Protective Force officer signal to proceed (during a non-emergency). During an emergency, use bypass lane.

# **Vehicle Inspection**

All vehicles passing through the VAPs are subject to inspection. Reasons for inspection may include a change in SECON level or observation of suspicious activities and/or circumstances. If your vehicle is chosen to be inspected, follow the directions of the Protective Force officer.
