MidFirst Bank, a federally chartered savings association headquartered in Oklahoma, appreciates the opportunity to comment on the proposed amendments to Regulation D Reserve Requirements of Depository Institutions as published in the February 12, 2008, Federal Register. MidFirst strongly supports the elimination of the Regulation D three transaction limitation for certain savings account transactions. In so doing, the Federal Reserve proposes that all transactions from a savings deposit account that are subject to transaction limitations be limited, in aggregate, to no more than six per month or statement cycle. By establishing a uniform and consistent limitation applicable to all such transactions, the Federal Reserve is reducing regulatory burden, promoting operational efficiency, minimizing overhead costs, and implementing a mechanism more readily understood by both customers and institution employees. Further, the increase in permitted check and debit card transactions from three to six is a marginal increase that will have minimal effect on national monetary flows which is the reason the transaction limitations were originally established.
