Subject: Proposed Revision to OMB Circular A-76

To Whom It May Concern,

Having worked on several MEO studies and performance work studies during previous jobs, I submit the following comments.

- 1. Information flow is critical. Keeping employees in the dark hurts morale and decreases productivity.
- 2. Preparing government documentation to prepare for an A-76 study can become a full-time job and the mission at hand is going to suffer.
- 3. One year is too short to complete the process.
- 4. Identifying a competition will result in the loss of key government people. Some highly skilled employees will seek other jobs rather than persevere through the painful, and often times irregular process.
- 5. The government is at an inherent disadvantage in competing with the private sector because government organizations do not have staff on board who specialize in preparing A-76 documentation. On the other hand, the private sector does have staff who specialize in A-76 documentation. This can result in the private sector winning competitions because they are better prepared at writing proposals, but not necessarily at performing the mission.
- 6. After a function is identified for competition, the government should be given a period of time (up to one year) to receive training and to prepare a team for the competition before the A-76 clock starts.
