NATIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH PERFORMANCE STANDARDS PROGRAM

The National Public Health Performance Standards Program (NPHPSP) is a **partnership** among seven national public health organizations with the goal of improving the **practice** of public health and the **performance** of public health systems. There are three assessment instruments that guide State and local public health **systems**, and local governance entities, in evaluating themselves with **optimal standards**. The NPHPSP helps State and local public health partners determine “Are we doing the right things?” and “How can we improve our performance?”

THE 10 ESSENTIAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES



The NPHPSP is designed to measure and improve public health system performance at the state and local levels. Under the leadership of CDC and its partner organizations, many state, local and board representatives have contributed to the development of the performance standards.

The NPHPSP includes three assessment instruments to assist state and local partners in assessing and improving their public health systems or boards of health.

- **State Public Health System Performance Assessment**
- **Local Public Health System Performance Assessment Instrument**
- **Local Public Health Governance Performance Assessment Instrument**

These instruments are based on the framework of the ten Essential Public Health Services, the spectrum of public health activities that should be provided in all communities.
