Dear Director Willden:

Thank you for the timely submission of Nevada's FFY 2006 Annual Performance Report (APR) and revised State Performance Plan (SPP) under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), as amended in 2004. We also acknowledge the revisions to Nevada's APR received on April 14, 2008. We appreciate the State's efforts in preparing these documents.

The Department has determined that, under IDEA sections 616(d) and 642, Nevada needs assistance in meeting the requirements of Part C of the IDEA. The Department's determination is based on the totality of the State's data and information including the State's FFY 2006 APR and revised SPP, other State-reported data, information obtained through on-site verification and focused monitoring visits, and other publicly available information. See the enclosure entitled "How the Department Made Determinations under Sections 616(d) and 642 of the IDEA in 2008" for further details.

Specific factors affecting OSEP's determination of needs assistance for Nevada for FFY 2005 include the following: (1) for Indicator 1, the State reported 59.2% compliance with the timely service provision requirements, and did not report correction of prior findings of noncompliance; (2) for Indicator 8B, the State reported 73.4% compliance with the LEA notification requirements; and (3) for Indicator 9, the State reported 82% compliance with the requirements for timely correcting noncompliance. For these reasons, we were unable to determine that Nevada met requirements for FFY 2006 under IDEA sections 616(d) and 642. OSEP notes that the State reported correction for Indicators 7, 8A, and 8C. The 45-day timeline requirements of Indicator 7 are the subject of special conditions on Nevada's Part C FFY 2007 grant award. OSEP will respond in Nevada's FFY 2008 Part C grant letter regarding the State's progress under its FFY 2007 Part C grant special conditions. We hope that your State will demonstrate in next year's APR that it meets requirements.

The enclosed table provides OSEP's analysis of the State's FFY 2006 APR and revised SPP and identifies, by indicator, OSEP's review of any revisions made by the State to its targets, improvement activities (timelines and resources) and baseline data in the State's SPP. It also identifies, by indicator, the State's status in meeting its targets, whether the State's data reflect progress or slippage, and whether the State corrected noncompliance and provided valid and reliable data.

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Our mission is to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation.

As you know, your State must report annually to the public on the performance of each early intervention service (EIS) program located in the State on the targets in the SPP under IDEA sections 616(b)(2)(C)(ii)(l) and 642. In addition, your State must review EIS program performance against targets in the State's SPP, determine if each EIS program meets the requirements of the IDEA and inform each EIS program of its determination. Finally, if you included revisions to baseline, targets or improvement activities in your APR submission, and OSEP accepted those revisions, please ensure that you update your SPP accordingly and that the updated SPP is made available to the public.
