I've mentioned this idea to some of you already - the basic idea is to create an alternate center of gravity for the Java language, composed of leading development tools vendors. I've floated this idea with Symantec (Mansour Safai), Rich Landsman (Borland), and our own tools group (andersh), and sent mail to PowerSoft (no reply so far).

I'd like to move forward on starting this group (charlesf would drive, with help from peterpla (I presume) in DRG), here are at least some of the items for the agenda of the first meeting. I would want to send this list to each tool vendor, and have each of them present on their priorities & thoughts, and then figure out how to make concrete forward progress with each other and JavaSoft:

- Boycott inner classes
 - Add Closures instead?
- Conditional compilation
- Enumerations
- Add properties
 - Would permit associative arrays, other Python features(?)
- Debug class
 - Asserts
 - Debug outs
 - Final members, compiler can remove the call to empty classes for retail build
- Sign a pledge - moratorium on language changes for 1-2 years (Symantec suggested this)
- And of course legal structure of the coalition

If anyone has any concerns (or more items), please holler - I'd like to start contacting tools ISVs in earnest by the middle of next week (after we issue our AFC press release).
