Applicants must have at least two years of post J.D. experience to be qualified at the GS-13 level; two and a half years of post J.D. experience to be qualified at the GS-14 level; and five years of post J.D. experience to be qualified at the GS-15 level. Applicants should also possess an in-depth knowledge of Federal and/or state capital case investigations and prosecutions; experience dealing with complex legal and policy issues; and superior writing skills.
