(Washington, DC)— The Court Services and Offender Supervision Agency (CSOSA—a federal executive branch entity) and the faith community of Washington, DC announce a series of events designed to highlight successful partnerships and to encourage others to join in providing support to returning offenders.

CSOSA provides probation and post-incarceration supervision of approximately 15,500 offenders in DC. CSOSA provides comprehensive, public safety oriented programming and treatment services combining strict accountability with meaningful opportunity. Each year, approximately 2,000 offenders return from federal correctional institutions to the District of Columbia. Many of them need services and the support of strong community institutions to remain drug and crime free.

Over 40 faith institutions throughout the city are working with CSOSA to provide the men and women returning home with fellowship and needed support services.
