President Bush Uses State of the Union Speech to Urge Faith-Based and Community Organizations Support for Returning Offenders

Reentry Week Activities in DC Highlight Ongoing Local Faith-Based Efforts to Assist Offenders Returning From Prison

"As President Bush noted in his State of the Union speech, offenders returning from incarceration face tremendous challenges. Their ultimate success will depend on CSOSA and the faith-based and community organizations working together to provide structure, accountability, guidance and opportunity. Our public safety goals are met when returning offenders become productive citizens," said Paul A. Quander, Jr., Director of the Court Services and Offender Supervision Agency.

(Washington, DC)—In his State of the Union speech Tuesday evening, President George W. Bush proposed "A plan to harness the resources and experience of faith-based and community organizations in dealing with the challenges of helping returning inmates contribute to society."

The (federal) Court Services and Offender Supervision Agency (CSOSA) and the faith community of Washington, DC enthusiastically embrace the President's remarks, and announce a series of events designed to highlight three years of successful partnerships and to encourage others to join in providing support to returning offenders. Crime prevention, enhancing services to returning offenders and addressing the needs of offenders' families are primary themes of the 2004 Reentry Week activities.

Established in 1997, CSOSA provides probation and post-incarceration services to approximately 15,000 criminal offenders in DC. CSOSA provides comprehensive, public safety oriented programming and treatment services combining accountability with meaningful opportunity. Each year, approximately 2,000 offenders return from federal correctional institutions to the District of Columbia.

"Reentry Week" activities are designed to bring attention to the supervision and support needs of offenders, to highlight successful existing efforts, and to solicit new partners in the greater Washington, DC community.
