PERFORMANCE BUDGET

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GENERAL STATEMENT

Introduction

In response to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the Congress funded a series of FY 2002 relief actions in the Department of Defense appropriations bill. Among the actions funded was the provision of \$175,000,000 for a new Workers' Compensation account in the Employment and Training Administration of the Department of Labor, to be made available from amounts provided in the FY 2001 Emergency Supplemental Appropriation in the Emergency Response Fund. These relief actions were directed to New York State to compensate workers who were injured disabled, or killed as a result of the terrorist attacks.

Appropriation language included with the Workers' Compensation account directed that \$125,000,000 be for payment to the New York State Workers' Compensation Review Board for processing of claims related to the terrorist attacks, \$25,000,000 be for payment to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursement of claims related to the attacks, and \$25,000,000 be for payment to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursement of claims related to the first response emergency services personnel who were injured, were disabled, or died due to the attacks.

In FY 2006, of the funds provided under Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2002 (Public Law 107-117), the Congress rescinded \$120,000,000 in the Department of Labor Appropriations Act, 2006. In addition, \$50,000,000 was appropriated in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2006.

There is no appropriation request for budget authority in FY 2008. The funding enacted in FY 2006 will remain available until expended.

ANALYSIS OF APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE

No funds are requested in FY 2008. The provisions in FY 2006 appropriations were for a one-time rescission of \$120,000,000 in unexpended balances and a one-time provision of funds for payment of \$50,000,000 to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursement of claims related to the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks and for reimbursement of claims related to the first response emergency services personnel who were injured, disabled, or died due to the attacks.

In FY 2006, of funds provided in the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2002 (Public Law 107-111, division B), \$120,000,000 were rescinded, Department of Labor Appropriations Act, 2006. In addition to the amounts provided elsewhere in the Act, \$50,000,000 were appropriated to the Department of Labor, to remain available until expended, for payment to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursement of claims related to the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on the United States and for reimbursement of claims related to the first response emergency services personnel who were injured, were disabled, or died due to such terrorist attacks, Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2006.

BUDGET ACTIVITY: Workers' Compensation Program Employment and Training Administration Funds for the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund

Introduction

In response to the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the Congress funded a series of FY 2002 relief actions in the Department of Defense appropriations bill. Among actions funded was the provision of \$175,000,000 for a new Workers' Compensation account in the Employment Training Administration of the Department of Labor, to be made available from amounts provided in the FY 2001 Emergency Supplemental Appropriation in the Emergency Response Fund. These relief actions were directed to New York State to compensate workers who were injured, disabled, or killed as a result of the terrorist attacks.

In FY 2006, of the funds provided under Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2002, the Congress rescinded \$120,000,000 of unexpended balances in the Department of Labor Appropriations Act, 2006. In addition, \$50,000,000 was appropriated in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2006.

There is no request for budget authority in FY 2008. The funding appropriated in FY 2006 will remain available until expended.

Both an appropriation and a rescission were enacted in FY 2006. The rescission of \$120,000,000 in the Department of Labor Appropriations Act, 2006, eliminated unexpended balances from the amount provided in FY 2002 appropriations to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursements related to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. The Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2006, provided \$50,000,000 to the New York State Uninsured Employers Fund for reimbursement of claims related to the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks and for reimbursement of claims related to the first response emergency services personnel who were injured, disabled, or died due to the attacks.
