A Dairy Queen had three one-quarter inch plate glass windows blown out and the broken glass injured four people...although none seriously. The River Valley Pioneer Museum had suffered roof damage which led to some water damage inside the museum. **Randall County** 12 ESE Canyon 0 Flash Flood 20 Park Ranger at Palo Duro Canyon State Park closed Park Road 5 at the number one water crossing **Randall County** 14 ESE Canyon 20 2124CST 2359CST Flash Flood Palo Duro Canyon State Park Ranger reported five feet of fast-flowing water at the first water crossing with water getting up into the Hackberry campsite. There was likely six feet of fast-flowing water further back in the park at the other water crossings **Randall County** 0 Flash Flood 12 ESE Canyon 21 0000CST Palo Duro Canyon State Park Ranger reported that the water depth at the first water crossing was still four feet of fast-flowing water. Campers were unable to leave the park. **Randall County** 14 ESE Canyon Flash Flood 1255CST Palo Duro Canyon State Park Ranger reported that water crossing number two was still impassable with three feet of fast-flowing water and runoff was still occurring. The Park Road remains closed. **Randall County** 0 12 ESE Canyon 21 0 Flash Flood Palo Duro Canyon State Park Ranger reported three feet of fast-flowing water still over water crossing number two...two feet of fast-flowing water over water crossing numbers five and six...and one foot of fast-flowing water over water crossings numbers three and four. **Moore County** Masterson 21 1741CST 0 0 Flash Flood Up to one foot of water reported on U.S. Highway 87 near Masterson. Water was accumulating in a dip or low part in the highway and cars were stopping rapidly upon encountering the water. Law enforcement dispatcher reported that Farm to Market Roads 722 and 2202 were both flooded but not closed. **Potter County** 3 W Amarillo 43K 21 1900CST 0 Flash Flood A teenage boy was playing outside at West Hills Park located at Amarillo Boulevard and Western Street around 1830 CST and was sucked into a tunnel that was part of the park's drainage system. Water is reported to be up and over the curb at Arden Road and also at **Randall County** 5 SW Amarillo 21 2020CST 24K Flash Flood 2330CST Two vehicles were stalled at 45th Avenue and Coulter Street with two feet of water reported on the sides of the road with one foot of water in the middle. Slow-moving thunderstorms with very heavy rainfall produced flash flooding across the southcentral Texas panhandle.
