

Sioux Indian Museum

The Sioux Indian Museum displays an extensive array of historic clothing plus horse gear, weapons, household implements, baby carriers and toys.

A series of promotional sales exhibitions introduces unsurpassed contemporary Sioux Indian arts and crafts by emerging artists and crafts persons.

The Museum was founded in 1939 through the cooperation of the Federal and Rapid City governments. It is administered by the Indian Arts and Crafts Board, a separate agency of the US Department of the Interior that promotes the development of contemporary American Indian and Alaska Native arts.
