SUMMARY: This document contains a correction to the final regulations, which were published Wednesday, November 25, 1998 (63 FR 65284). SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

Background

The final regulations that are the subject of this correction represent a complete revision of the regulations governing claims under the FECA, which provides benefits to all civilian Federal employees and certain other groups of employees and individuals who are injured or killed while performing their jobs.

Need for Correction

As published, the final regulations contained several errors. Corrections were published Wednesday, December 23, 1998 (63 FR 71202). However, through oversight, an error remained in § 10.220(g), where the reference to the number of days within which use of continuation of pay must begin is stated incorrectly.

Correction of Publication

Accordingly, the Publication on November 25, 1998 of the final regulations, which were the subject of FR Doc. 98–31190, is corrected as follows:

§10.220 [Corrected]

On page 65317, in the first column, paragraph (g) is corrected by replacing "30" with "45".
