NEW EMBASSY COMPOUND

DISCUSSION TOPICS

- Setting green goals what are the targets set by new Federal Mandates and can we comply? What are the research, tools, and technologies being used and proposed to achieve the energy and water efficiency targets set by the Energy Independence and Security Act 2007 (EISAct 2007), Executive Order (EO) 13423 of 2007, and Energy Policy Act 2005 (EPAct 2005)?
- Getting it done what are the specific Energy Conservation Measures (ECM) we can implement in both new and existing facilities to reduce dependence on foreign oil and meet energy needs in underdeveloped areas?

New Construction — how does Life-Cycle-Cost-Analysis justify the first cost for long-term payoffs? OBO's Budget Planning, Initial Planning Survey, and Integrated Planning Review processes can identify, calculate and track both construction cost as well as estimated operating costs. This planning method is used by OBO to justify investments in technologies and strategies that significantly reduce long-term operating costs.

Existing Facilities — how to use Energy Savings Performance Contracting (ESPC) overseas? ESPC is a contracting vehicle designed to provide a means to reduce energy costs, improve operational reliability, and reduce maintenance costs of equipment, without increasing annual budget outlays. ESPC is authorized by 42 USC 8287, which allows Federal agencies to enter into multi-year contracts lasting up to 25 years. OBO is partnering with DOE/FEMP to implement ESPCs on a large scale.

- Measuring up how are web-based tracking and certification tools working to document high-performance buildings? EISAct 2007 requires the use a web-based tracking. DOE has proposed adding two additional Federal Real Property Profile (FRPP) data elements to track and report compliance with EO 13423; the first for applicability of the EO to the asset and the second for meeting the sustainability goals of the EO.
- Eco-Diplomacy What are the opportunities to build positive international relations around green commitments and accomplishments? OBO supports the League of Green US Embassies and other public affairs initiatives to enhance local perception of the US by building green. A web portal allows shared access to best practices, case studies, and energy savings tools. A Green Guide for Embassy and Consulate operations will be issued in 2008 to support the members in developing their individual green goals and a green page for DOS/OBO's website is being formulated. The League intends to act collectively and leverage Public Affairs to highlight green accomplishments.

Open forum — Ways to increase the contractor pool in the overseas environment. Recognizing that OBO is interested in increasing the number of bidders on its capital projects, what experiences have our industry counterparts had with methods to achieve this? What would attract bidders to the table, and what would dive them away? What have they encountered regarding contract types, delivery methods, and the allocation of project risks?
