Thank you for your July 6 letter acknowledging OSHA's interim response to your information correction request and asking the Agency to take note of information on its *Lumber and Building Material Dealer Industry* Web page.

OSHA has carefully considered the issues you raise in your letter. After reviewing the Web page in light of your concerns, OSHA has decided to remove from the Web page the link to the Princeton Plasma Physics Laboratory Environmental Safety and Health Directive (Directive) and the associated text. As you know, links to external documents from OSHA's Web site include a disclaimer stating that the links are provided only for the public's convenience in accessing related information and that OSHA does not endorse or take responsibility for the accuracy of the information presented. In this instance, however, we are concerned that the link could result in some confusion for the public and employers and employees in the lumber and building material dealer industry.
