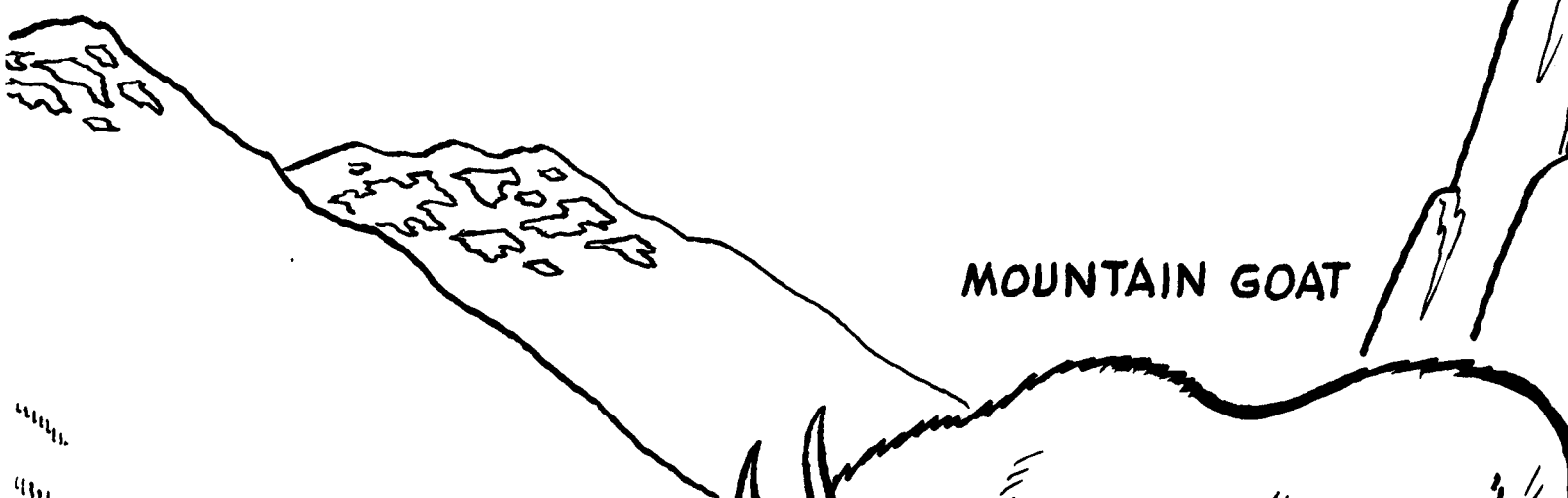
Uncontrolled, wild fires can damage the homes for wildlife. Controlled fires are frequently used to improve wildlife habitat, the place where wildlife lives.



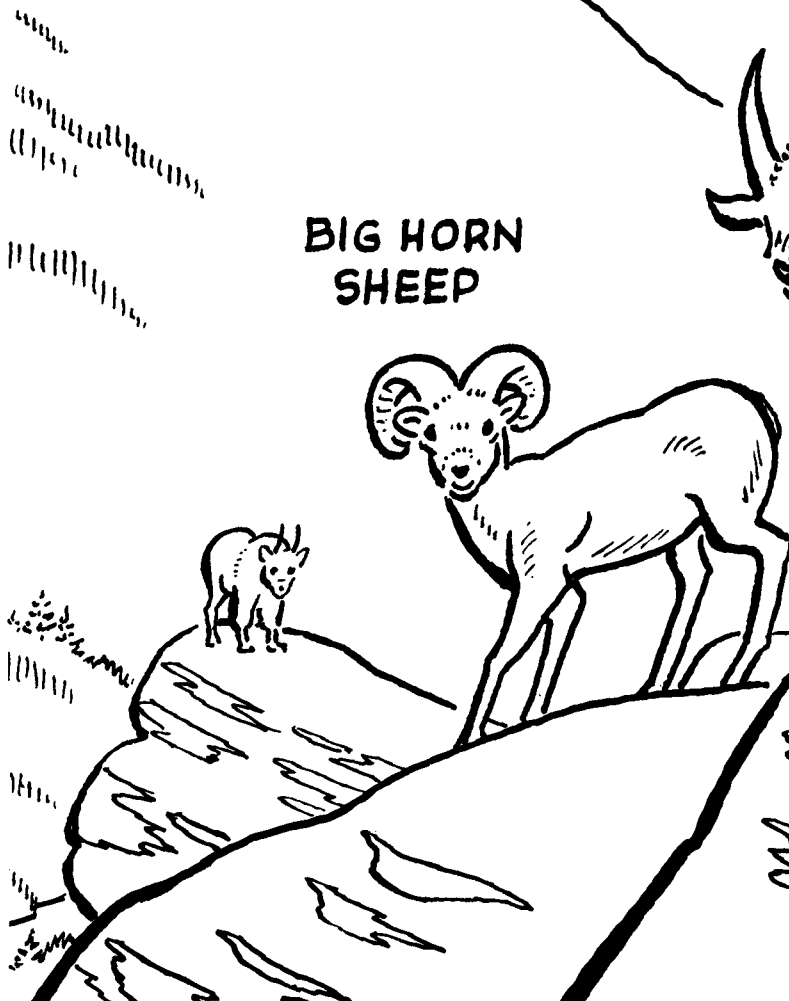

Answers:
 1. The dragonfly is different because it is an insect; the others are birds.
 2. A bullfrog is not a reptile like the others; it is an amphibian.
 3. Jellyfish are not really fish at all—they are called invertebrate. The others are true fish.
 4. Turtles are reptiles. The other animals are mammals.

You can begin feeding birds any time of the year. But remember, if you begin feeding birds in the winter, they may come to depend on you for food so keep your feeder full during this time.

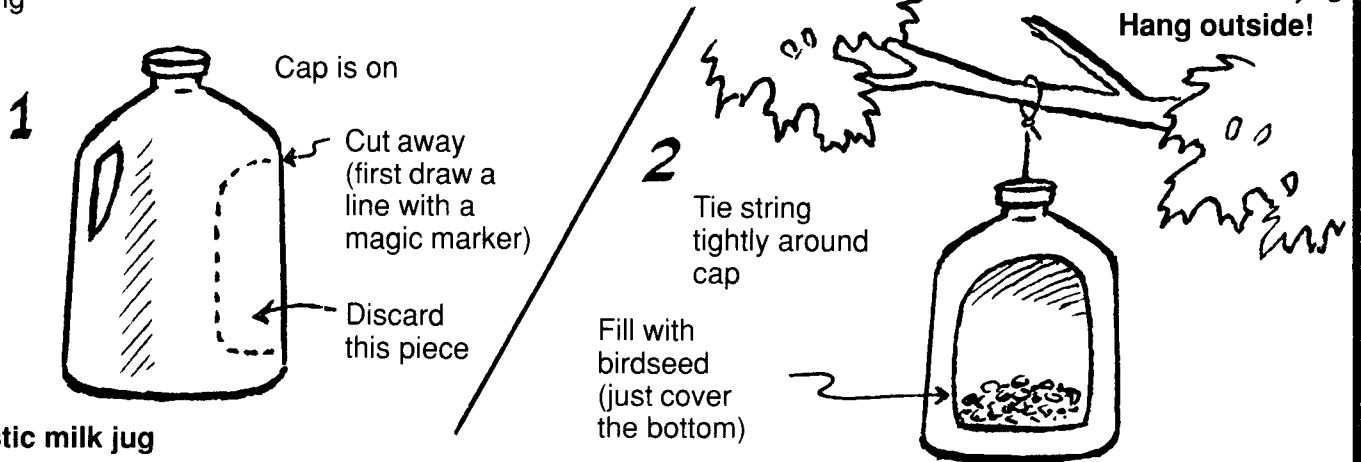
Building a bird feeder is easy and fun! Hang your bird feeder near a window and enjoy watching your new found friends!

- string



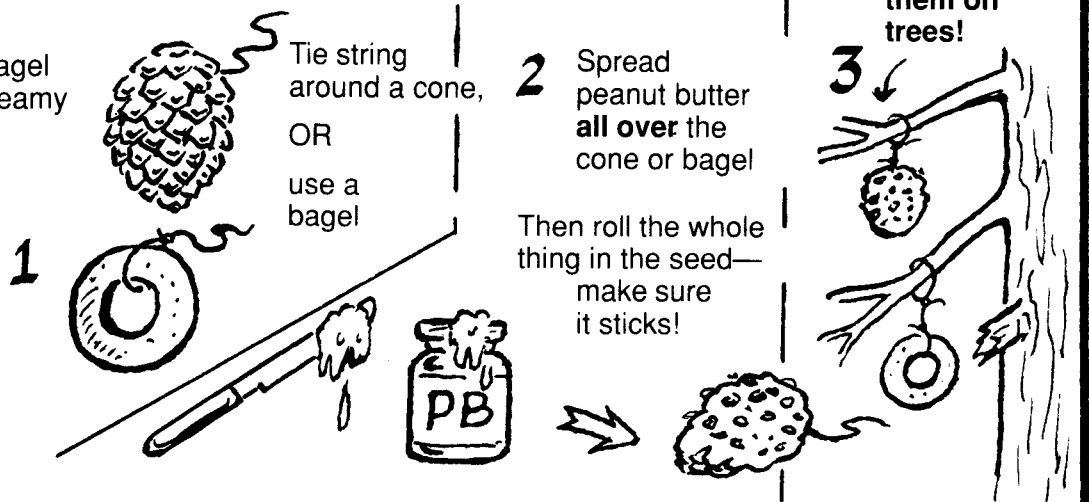

(Squirrels love these, too!)



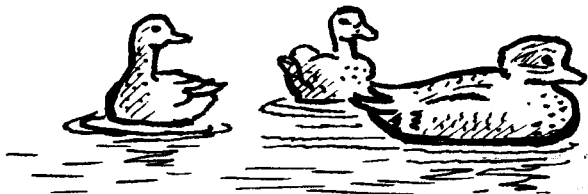
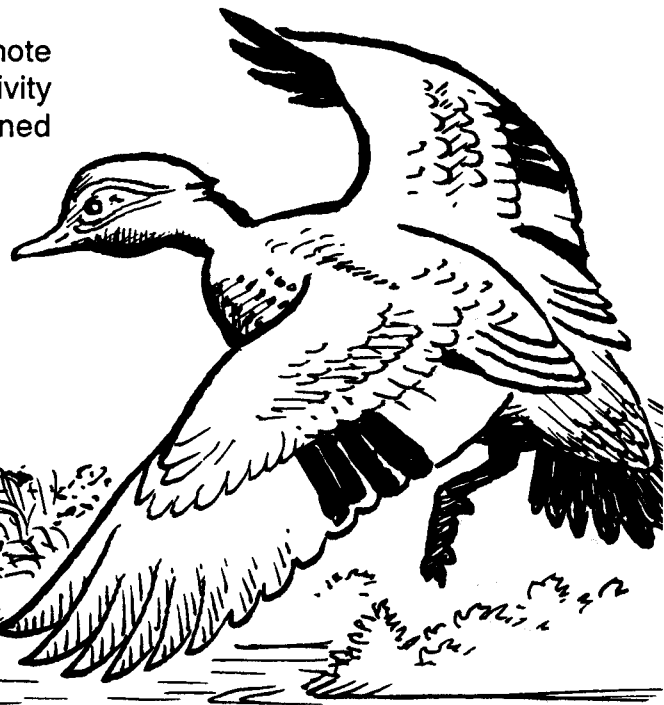


Mark Trail/Ed Dodd Foundation
