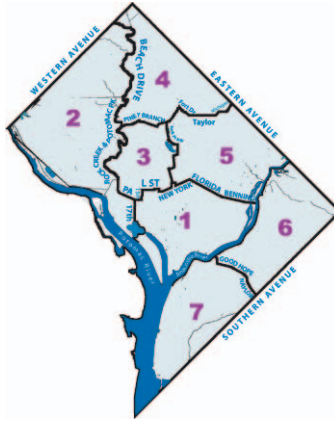

REGULATING ALCOHOL ESTABLISHMENTS



Establishments licensed to sell and/or serve alcoholic beverages in the city are regulated by the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA). Infractions of the laws and regulations governing the sale and/or serving of alcohol are prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office for the District of Columbia. Both agencies work closely with the U.S. Attorney's Office and MPD to coordinate strategies to work with establishments in the city.

COMBATING GUN VIOLENCE



In 2003, 193 people were killed with guns in the District of Columbia. Over 1,950 firearms were recovered from the streets of our city and almost 1,000 criminals were convicted for carrying and/or using a gun. Smarter policing and aggressive prosecution have succeeded in ensuring violent criminals are held accountable for their actions, but more needs to be done. Law enforcement is committed to working with the community to combat gun violence and build safer neighborhoods across the District.

IDENTITY THEFT



Last year, the FTC received 9,338 identity fraud complaints from victims in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area - 84% of these complaints were from victims ranging in age from 20-59. Working adults are prime targets because they have a steady income and are, arguably, more easily distracted. This combination provides fertile ground for identity thieves to thrive. JUVENILE CRIME & CAR THEFT



The Metropolitan Police Department reports that in 2003 there were 9,549 cars stolen in the District of Columbia – a rate of more than one car stolen every hour. Auto theft is a serious crime that costs victims time, money, significant inconvenience and often financial loss. A significant number of vehicles in the District are stolen by juvenile offenders, and juvenile arrests for car theft is up 10% in 2004.
