## **JACKSONVILLE MAN GETS OVER TWO YEARS IN PRISON FOR MAKING COUNTERFEIT TRAVELERS CHEQUES**

Jacksonville, Florida - Today, United States District Judge Virginia M. Hernandez sentenced Joseph Glenn, age 27, of Jacksonville to 27 months imprisonment. Glenn previously pleaded guilty to conspiracy to manufacture, possess and pass counterfeit American Express Travelers Cheques. The amount of loss associated with this conspiracy is approximately \$100,000.

According to court documents, Glenn passed the counterfeit travelers checks in the Jacksonville area between April 2003 and August 2004. Glenn was arrested by agents assigned to the Northeast Florida High Tech Crimes Task Force in January 2007. He fled after he was released on bond, and was featured on First Coast Crimestoppers before he was again apprehended in August 2007.

The case was investigated by the United States Secret Service's Northeast Florida High Tech Crimes Task Force. It was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Kathleen O'Malley, a Senior Litigation Counsel.
