He made me believe that I could accomplish anything I set my mind to.

In 1993, I created the Darrell Green Youth Life Learning Center to give all students, regardless of race or family income, an opportunity to participate in a program that enhances their academic development. We have quality instructors who monitor the students' schoolwork, often tutoring one-on-one to supplement what a child is learning in school. The exposure to quality instructors has had an overwhelming impact on our students. Many have become academic scholars, confident public speakers, and well-rounded young people rising to face life's challenges.

A great teacher is like a great coach. A great coach takes you from just playing the game to playing your absolute best, while a great teacher takes you beyond the classroom and prepares you for lifelong learning and future success.
