OMB To Unveil Gov Online Learning Center Tomorrow New Virtual E-Training Site Provides Tools for Professional Development 10 a.m. Office of Personnel Management

Washington, D.C. – The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) will tomorrow debut a new e-training Web Site, The Gov Online Learning Center, granting federal employees access to online job training and professional information. The Web Site can be viewed at <u>www.golearn.gov</u> after its official launch.

The Gov Online Learning Center provides a one-stop access to a 3-D virtual classroom connecting visitors with 30 course programs, more than 50 electronic books, and a resource center linking to reference guides and libraries nationwide. This E-Gov Initiative serves to unify training across federal agencies and to streamline the government by increasing its efficiency.

The President's E-Government Strategy, released by the Office of Management and Budget and guided by the President's Management Council, has identified 24 E-Government Initiatives to integrate agency operations and information technology investments. E-Government is an integral part of the President's Management Agenda to streamline business-to-government transactions, save taxpayer dollars and make it easier for citizens to interact with the government.
