Request For Comments on "Data Enabled" or "Smart" Bankruptcy Forms

Introduction

This document presents a concept document for an implementation of "data enabled" or "smart" bankruptcy forms. The Administrative Office for the United States Courts (AOUSC) and the United States Trustee Program (USTP) are considering accepting forms with embedded data. If such a "data enabled" or "smart" forms were released for general use, a standard data schema defined in advance by the AOUSC and USTP would need to be used. The purpose of this document is to present this concept for review and solicit comments.

If accepted, this concept would immediately become an interim standard for electronic filing of bankruptcy petitions and other bankruptcy forms. The use of interim standards is up to local court rules. Final national standards may require approval of the Director of the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, one or more committees of the Judicial Conference of the United States, itself.

This concept document is based on the current bankruptcy forms. Because of the Bankruptcy Reform Act, new versions of the forms will be issued by the Bankruptcy Rule Committee over the next two years. This concept document will be updated as new forms are released.

Concept

This initiative is the culmination of several years of research and planning between the AOUSC and the USTP. For many reasons, most of them obvious, federal agencies must look at ways to efficiently use new technology to meet its core missions. As of FY2005, the majority of U. S. Bankruptcy Courts are accepting filings through an Electronic Case Filing (ECF) interface. Accordingly, the majority of all new petitions, statements of financial affairs, and schedules are submitted as a Portable Document Format (PDF) files. The AOUSC and the USTP has determined that the Case Management/Electronic Case Filing (CM/ECF) system "as is" will accept "data enabled" forms. A "data enabled" or "smart" form is a PDF document that is filled out on-line, either via a software program or by downloading the form from the Internet, and then saved as a PDF file containing data tags that are not visible to the user, but which "mark" each piece of data entered into the individual fields on the form with a tag.

To illustrate this concept, the AOUSC and the USTP have attached two sample "data enabled" or "smart" forms, Voluntary Petition and Schedule J. These two sample forms depict the proposed approach for labeling the data elements and for organizing the data tags within the forms. The final "data enabled" or "smart" form filed through CM/ECF would still be a PDF that is viewable in the same manner as the current process, but the PDF would now also contain the data tags defined by the new schema.

*** <u>Please Note:</u> The sample data tag names are not the proposed data tag names. They merely depict the proposed concept approach. If this concept is fully implemented, the AOUSC

and the USTP fully expect these naming conventions to change prior to final implementation.

*** <u>Please Note:</u> Under this proposed concept, there will still be an exception process for the general users that does not have access to completing the "data enabled" or "smart" form.

Proposed Data Schema

The proposed data schema for the "data enabled" or "smart" forms is based on the interim filing format standard, PDF/A, currently in place for CM/ECF. Expanding upon this approach, the AOUSC and the USTP propose the use of Name and Value tags (AcroForms) within PDF documents. This approach does not follow the current industry trend towards XML tags (which is supported in PDF/A version 1.5 or higher), however, the AOUSC and the USTP feel that it is more important to remain compatible with the PDF/A standard ^{1/2} at this time to ensure all CM/ECF PDFs are compatible with the long time archival of digital records. In addition, AOUSC and USTP research indicates that there are ample Open Source and commercial tool sets available to create, read, and extract data from Name/Value tags within PDF documents. Therefore, the AOUSC and the USTP believe that the use of AcroForm in PDF/A documents is the most viable approach to take at this time. AcroForms (also called Interactive Forms) are defined in the PDF 1.4 standard, section 8.6:
