U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Releases Recommendations for Lower Snake River National Fish Hatcheries

Stakeholder Meetings Planned for September 2008

The Service will host public stakeholder meetings on the Hatchery Review Team's draft report of their review of the Lower Snake River National Fish Hatcheries (NFH) (Dworshak, Kooskia, and Hagerman facilities). Dworshak NFH and Kooskia NFH contribute to salmon and steelhead production in the Clearwater River Basin and Hagerman NFH contributes to steelhead and trout production in the Salmon River Basin and Southern Idaho, respectively. The draft report is being prepared by a Hatchery Review Team that began an analysis of the Lower Snake facilities last summer. The team, comprised of scientists from the Fish and Wildlife Service and other federal agencies, was convened by the Service's Pacific Region Fisheries Program. The draft report includes the team's assessments, recommendations and initial co-manager comments. The Service will accept public comments on the draft report for 30 days beginning September 30, 2008.

The purpose of this meeting is for the Hatchery Review Team to present an overview of the review process and details of their Lower Snake NFH review. This meeting will provide the public with an opportunity to discuss the report and its draft recommendations with members of the Hatchery Review Team.

The review of the Lower Snake facilities is part of a four-year review process that began in October 2005 with the goal of improving salmon and steelhead hatcheries owned or operated by the Service in the Pacific Region, and to ensure that those facilities are best meeting conservation goals, harvest goals, and tribal trust and mitigation responsibilities now and in the future. The review will include the 12 National Fish Hatcheries in the Columbia River Basin, the three National Fish Hatcheries on Washington's Olympic Peninsula, and nine additional federal hatcheries operated as part of the Lower Snake River Compensation Plan.
