Refuge Facts

- Established: 1938.
- Acres: 1,850.
- Location: Lake Isom NWR shares a common headquarters with Reelfoot NWR, located 15 miles southwest of Union City, TN on Highway 157 near the Walnut Log Community.

Natural History

- Refuge habitat created by a series of violent earthquakes from December 1811 to February 1812.
- Concentrations of ducks, geese, raptors, wading birds and shore birds.
- Eagle and osprey nests.
- Habitat acreage:
 - Open water: 592.
 - Wetlands: 222.

Woodlands: 537.

Croplands: 499.

- Staffed by Reelfoot NWR employees.
