Archival Access Issues Symposium May 24, 2007

The Eisenhower Presidential Library and Kansas City Area Archivists (KCAA) are co-sponsoring a symposium on Archival Access Issues on May 24, 2007 in Abilene, Kansas. Speakers from Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska and Massachusetts will address a wide range of topics relating to access to historical documents. Subjects of the presentations will include specific issues relating to archeological records, prison records, patient case files, and copyright restrictions. Karl Weissenbach, former Director of the Nixon Presidential Materials Project will discuss access to the Richard M. Nixon presidential materials as case studies of access issues. The lunchtime speaker, Kansas State Archivist Matt Veatch, will discuss providing access to digital documents and electronic records.

Persons interested in the topic of access to archival records, are invited to attend. Registration is only \$15.00 including lunch and \$10.00 without the lunch program.
