# **ABOUT THE ACHP**


### CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

#### ACHP MEMBERSHIP

An independent Federal agency, the ACHP promotes historic preservation nationally by providing a forum for influencing Federal activities, programs, and policies that impact historic properties. Our members are:

- eight non-Federal members appointed by the President
- a Native Hawaiian appointed by the President
- a governor appointed by the President
- a mayor appointed by the President
- the Secretaries of Interior, Agriculture, Defense, and Transportation
- the Administrators of the Environmental Protection Agency and General Services Administration
- the Chairman of the National Trust for Historic Preservation
- the Architect of the Capitol
- the President of the National Conference of State Historic Preservation Officers

A professional staff, which supports the ACHP's daily operations, is headquartered in Washington, DC, with an office in Lakewood, Colorado.

## WHAT WE DO

- Advise the President and Congress on historic preservation issues;
- Recommend legislative and administrative improvements to protect America's heritage;
- Ensure that, through the Section 106 review process, the public, Indian tribes, and State and local governments have a voice in Federal decisions that impact historic properties;
- Mediate between local historic preservation interests and Federal officials when the government's activities could adversely affect historic properties;
- Encourage Federal agencies to make their programs and policies advance national preservation goals established by Congress; and
- Educate stakeholders about the benefits of historic preservation and strategies to achieve them.
