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GYPSUM IN APRIL 2008

Producers mined 1.84 million metric tons (Mt) of gypsum in April 2008 (table 1). Output was 9% more than that of March 2008 and 7% more than that of April 2007. Synthetic gypsum production was 681,000 metric tons (t) in April 2008 (table 1), which was 6% more than that of March 2008 and 9% more than that of April 2007. Both mined and synthetic gypsum are used as raw material for wallboard. The wallboard industry is the leading domestic consumer of gypsum. During April 2008, synthetic gypsum accounted for about 21% of the 3.31-Mt total supply of gypsum in the United States. Sales of uncalcined gypsum in April 2008, mainly for portland cement manufacture and for agricultural uses, were 329,000 t (table 2), 3% more than those of March 2008 and 33% less than those of April 2007.

Output of calcined gypsum for April 2008 (table 1) was 1.65 Mt, 5% more than that of March 2008 and 6% more than that of April 2007. Sales of board products (table 2) were approximately 2.28 billion square feet (212 million square meters), slightly more than those of March 2008 and 4% less than those of April 2007.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, imports of crude gypsum in April 2008 were 788,000 t (table 3), 60% more than those of March 2008 and 11% more than those of April 2007.

The United States imported crude gypsum from seven countries in April 2008. Of these imports, Canada accounted for 69%, followed by Mexico with 25%, Spain with 5%, Jamaica with 1%, and negligible amounts from China, the United Kingdom, and Italy.

Gypsum wallboard imports for April 2008 were 28,000 t, equivalent to 3.11 million square meters (33.5 million square feet). These imports were 2% less than those of March 2008 and 39% less than those of April 2007. The United States imported wallboard products from three countries in April 2008. Mexico accounted for 53% of these imports, followed by Canada with 47%. Imports from China were negligible. Wallboard exports to 30 countries and territories in April 2008 were 9,600 t, equivalent to 1.1 million square meters (11.8 million square feet). These exports were about 18% more than those of March 2008 and 19% more than those of April 2007. Most wallboard exports were shipped to 23 western hemisphere countries, with Mexico accounting for 26%, followed by Canada with 17%.

All percentages in this report were computed based on unrounded data.
