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GYPSUM IN MAY 2008

Producers mined 1.69 million metric tons (Mt) of gypsum in May 2008 (table 1). Output was 8% less than that of April 2008 and 22% less than that of May 2007. Synthetic gypsum production was 640,000 metric tons (t) in May 2008 (table 1), which was 6% less than that of April 2008 and 3% less than that of May 2007. Both mined and synthetic gypsum are used as raw material for wallboard. The wallboard industry is the leading domestic consumer of gypsum. During May 2008, synthetic gypsum accounted for about 22% of the 2.95-Mt total supply of gypsum in the United States. Sales of uncalcined gypsum in May 2008, mainly for portland cement manufacture and for agricultural uses, were 328,000 t (table 2), slightly less than those of April 2008 and 32% less than those of May 2007.

Output of calcined gypsum for May 2008 (table 1) was 1.56 Mt, 5% less than that of April 2008 and 20% less than that of May 2007. Sales of board products (table 2) were approximately 2.15 billion square feet (199 million square meters), 6% less than those of April 2008 and 23% less than those of May 2007.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, imports of crude gypsum in May 2008 were 623,000 t (table 3), 21% less than those of April 2008 and 30% less than those of May 2007. The United States imported crude gypsum from seven countries in May 2008. Of these imports, Canada accounted for 64%, followed by Mexico with 26%, Spain with 7%, the Dominican Republic with 2%, Jamaica with 1%, and negligible amounts from China and Korea.

Gypsum wallboard imports for May 2008 were 26,300 t, equivalent to 2.89 million square meters (26.8 million square feet). These imports were 6% less than those of April 2008 and 43% less than those of May 2007. The United States imported wallboard products from three countries in May 2008. Canada accounted for 53% of these imports, followed by Mexico with 46%, and China with 1%. Wallboard exports to 31 countries and territories in May 2008 were 11,200 t, equivalent to 1.24 million square meters (11.5 million square feet). These exports were about 16% more than those of April 2008 and 29% more than those of May 2007. Although most wallboard exports were shipped to 24 western hemisphere countries, the United Arab Emirates accounted for 32% of total exports, followed by Mexico with 23%, Canada with 14%, and Hong Kong with 8%.

All percentages in this report were computed based on unrounded data.
