Introduction: The mission of the Pine Rockland Working Group (PRWG) is to maintain and restore the pine rockland natural community, its associated species and the natural processes, most notably fire, upon which they all depend. Through this collaborative, interdisciplinary, international effort, the PRWG seeks to increase basic understanding of the ecosystem and appropriate management practices by identifying, obtaining support for, and communicating the results of new research and coordinated monitoring efforts.

Conference Purpose: The purpose of this conference is to bring together the members of the PRWG and other individuals or groups that have an interest in pine rockland and related natural communities. This Conference is a continuation of the collaborative efforts begun in February 2004 with the "William B. Robertson, Jr., Memorial Pineland Fire Ecology and Management Workshop" and continued in February 2006 with the "Pine Rockland Conference 2006: Bridging the Gaps between Florida and the Bahamas."
