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GYPSUM IN JULY 2008

Producers mined 1.76 million metric tons (Mt) of gypsum in July 2008 (table 1). Output was 2% less than that of June 2008 and 15% less than that of July 2007. Synthetic gypsum production was 720,000 metric tons (t) in July 2008 (table 1), which was 3% more than that of June 2008 and 8% more than that of July 2007. Both mined and synthetic gypsum are used as raw material for wallboard. The wallboard industry is the leading domestic consumer of gypsum. During July 2008, synthetic gypsum accounted for about 22% of the 3.25-Mt total supply of gypsum in the United States. Sales of uncalcined gypsum in July 2008, mainly for portland cement manufacture and for agricultural uses, were 345,000 t (table 2), 5% less than those of June 2008 and 31% less than those of July 2007.

Output of calcined gypsum for July 2008 (table 1) was 1.65 Mt, 7% more than that of June 2008 and 12% less than that of July 2007. Sales of board products (table 2) were approximately 2.18 billion square feet (202 million square meters), 2% less than those of June 2008 and 15% less than those of July 2007.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, imports of crude gypsum in July 2008 were 762,000 t (table 3), 17% more than those of June 2008 and 10% less than those of July 2007. The United States imported crude gypsum from five countries in

July 2008. Of these imports, Canada accounted for 59%, followed by Mexico with 27%, Spain with 12%, the Dominican Republic with 2%, and a negligible amount from the Netherlands.

Gypsum wallboard imports for July 2008 were 26,000 t, equivalent to 2.89 million square meters (31.1 million square feet). These imports were 9% less than those of June 2008 and 28% less than those of July 2007. The United States imported wallboard products from five countries in July 2008. Mexico accounted for 50% of these imports, followed by Canada with 48%, and China with 2%. Imports from Hong Kong and Germany were negligible. Wallboard exports to 35 countries and territories in July 2008 were 9,500 t, equivalent to 1.1 million square meters (11.3 million square feet). These exports were about 2% more than those of June 2008 and 37% less than those of July 2007. Most wallboard exports were shipped to 24 western hemisphere countries, with Mexico accounting for 35%, followed by Canada with 18%.

All percentages in this report were computed based on unrounded data.
