THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF

NICARAGUA

The mineral industry of Nicaragua comprised the production of moderate but increasing quantities of gold and silver, as well as cement, gypsum, and sand and gravel. A small amount of refined products were produced for local consumption from imported oil. Near the end of the year, Hurricane Mitch did minor damage to the mining industry, but remediation was

undertaken promptly. Exploration continued in several parts of the country.
