## THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF

Malta's mineral industry rested mainly on trade and the storage of crude oil and refinery products, as well as other nonfuel mineral commodities. The mineral industry, consisting mainly of limestone and salt production, contributed less than 0.5% to the
