THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF

SIERRA LEONE

Mineral production in Sierra Leone consisted mainly of artisanal recovery of diamond and gold. A significant proportion of mineral production was in areas that remained under the control of the rebel forces of the Revolutionary United Front. The ongoing civil strife has adversely affected investment in natural resource development, although conditions could improve with the implementation of the July 1999 peace agreement.
