FAR-B SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

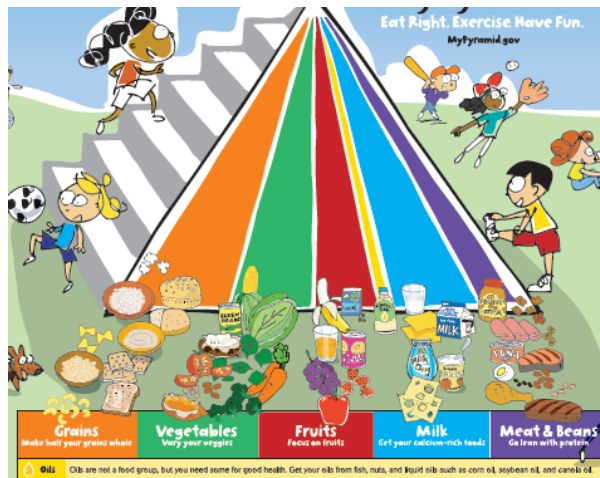
- Community education
