


## PER CAPITA INCOME IN 2007

The Bureau of Economic Analysis released today revised annual estimates of state personal income for 2005-2007. Revisions are usually made each September to incorporate source data that are more complete, more detailed, and otherwise more consistent than previously available. The average revision to the 2007 personal incomes of the 50 states and the District of Columbia was 0.3 percentage point.
