Benchmark Input-Output Accounts of the United States, 1997

THIS article presents the 1997 benchmark inputoutput (I-O) accounts, the latest in a series of accounts that provide the most detailed, integrated information available on the structure of the U.S. economy. The I-O accounts—including the detailed once-every-5-year benchmark accounts and the less detailed annual updates—provide an extensive accounting of the production of goods and services by each industry and commodity, which includes the goods and services purchased by each industry, the incomes earned in each industry, and the distribution of sales for each good and service to industries and final users. They also detail each industry's contribution to gross domestic product (GDP) and to its counterpart gross domestic income (GDI).

These accounts are used by industry analysts to assess such issues as the potential size of direct and indirect sales and the potential sources of growth. Analysts and policymakers can also use the accounts to assess the impact across industries and on consumers of increases in petroleum prices, insurance costs, and taxes. State and local government analysts use them through regional extensions of the I-O framework to assess the impact of base-closings or of major development projects. BEA and other statistical agencies use them to benchmark GDP and other key statistics.

The 1997 benchmark I-O accounts show the flows of 483 commodities to 491 industries and to 13 final uses. Final uses represent expenditures by households, government, and business for consumption or investment. The categories of final uses are personal consumption expenditures (PCE), gross private domestic investment, exports, imports, and government consumption expenditures and gross investment. GDP, which excludes intermediate purchases in order to avoid double counting (for example, of the semiconductors that go into computers or the flour that goes into bread) is by definition equal to the sum of all final

uses. The I-O accounts show the contribution made by the primary inputs (mainly labor and capital) to the output of each industry.

Value added is the difference between a firm's sales and its intermediate purchases of materials and services from other firms. It is equal to the contributions of capital and labor to the firm's sales as measured by the incomes that they receive. Because value added includes only the firm's own contribution to output, the sum of value added, and of the sum of the incomes earned in production, equals GDI and also GDP.

In 1997, total sales, or the gross output, of U.S. business was \$14.9 trillion; deducting the \$6.5 trillion in intermediate purchases yields a GDP of \$8.3 trillion. On average, intermediate purchases of materials, energy, and all other commodities accounted for 44 cents of each dollar of sales, and value added accounted for the remaining 56 cents (with 31 cents for compensation, 4 cents for indirect business taxes and nontax liabilities, and 20 cents for other value added).

The I-O accounts are the building blocks for other economic accounts, including BEA's national income and product accounts (NIPA's). The impact of the 1997 I-O accounts on the NIPA estimates of GDP expenditure and income components will be presented in a forthcoming issue of the Survey of Current Business.

The major changes introduced in the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts include the following:

- •Incorporated the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), which provides the accounts with a more relevant system for classifying industries, especially for services, than its predecessor Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system, which originated in the 1930s. As a result, the 1997 benchmark accounts provide greater detail on service industries—including those in the new sector "Information," which accounted for 4.4 percent of total value added.
- Pulled out certain service activities that had formerly been embedded in the statistical data and included them in industries that provide similar types of services. These activities consist of services provided by the central administrative offices and

other types of auxiliaries (such as trucking and legal services) of companies. This new treatment, which is part of the change to NAICS, ensures that the measure of services is independent of changes in company practices for outsourcing to other businesses. In the 1997 benchmark accounts, 3.1 percent of total value added is moved into these industries, mostly from manufacturing and from wholesale and retail trade.

- Presented the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts in a new featured set of "standard" tables that conform closely to the statistical data sources. These tables are more consistent with the GDP-by-industry accounts and the gross state product accounts and with other industry data that are based on information collected using NAICS.
- Adapted the software tool on BEA's Web site so users can interactively select and customize data from the benchmark I-O accounts. As a result, users can easily select, preview, and download data at different levels of aggregation and using different measures of value.

This article is presented in three parts. The first part summarizes the major changes to the 1997 benchmark accounts that result from the conversion from the SIC system to NAICS. The second part describes other major changes in classification, methodology, and presentation that have been introduced. The third part summarizes the methodology used to compile the accounts. A technical note describing the 1997 I-O tables is followed by several appendix tables that provide information on the classification of industries, value added, and final uses and bridge tables that link the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts to the NIPA's.

NAICS and Its Effects on the 1997 Benchmark I-O Accounts

Unlike the SIC, NAICS classifies industries based on the economic concept of production: Establishments are grouped according to the similarities of their production processes rather than the similarities of their products.² In using the concept of production, NAICS-based classifications are more in line with the principle underlying the I-O classifications: Industries are classified in the I-O accounts so that each industry has a unique production function.

One of the largest differences introduced by NAICS is that auxiliaries are now treated as establishments, classified by their production processes.³ In the SIC, the services provided by auxiliaries are measured as ex-

penses of the industry that uses the auxiliary service. In NAICS, the services that these auxiliaries provide are recognized as output, and the compensation paid to employees, indirect business tax and nontax liability, and depreciation make up the value added of auxiliaries. The incorporation of NAICS has enabled the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts to provide a better picture of the composition of the increasingly services-oriented U.S. economy. With this treatment, GDP does not increase; instead, the intermediate purchases and the value added of the auxiliaries are moved from the establishments that use their services to an industry with similar production processes.

A second significant change in NAICS is the additional detail provided for the services sector. NAICS recognizes that the focus of U.S. economic activity has been shifting from goods to services, so that services have been accounting for a greater share of GDP over time. Whereas the 1992 benchmark I-O accounts showed an aggregate sector "Services," NAICS allows for a more detailed breakdown that includes

- Professional and business services,
- Education and health services, and
- Leisure and hospitality services.

A third important change in NAICS is the introduction of the sector "Information." This new sector reflects the new and advanced technologies that play increasingly important roles in the U.S. economy. Thus, the effects of these technologies on the economy are shown together rather than being scattered among manufacturing, services, and communications.

As a result of the NAICS changes, nearly \$200 billion of value added was shifted from the goods-producing sectors to the services-providing sectors.⁵ Total economic activity itself has not changed, but BEA's measure of services in the economy has improved.

Treatment of auxiliaries

In the SIC, auxiliaries are classified as being part of the industry that uses their services.⁶ This treatment is best illustrated with an example. A plant that produces soft drinks uses the services of a central administrative office (CAO) that is located outside of the plant; this CAO handles activities such as paying invoices and providing payroll services for the soft drink plant. Under the SIC treatment, the intermediate purchases of

the CAO are included in the intermediate purchases of the soft drink plant, and the compensation, the indirect business tax and nontax liability, and the depreciation expenses of the auxiliary are reflected in the value added of the soft drink plant.

In NAICS, the services the CAO provides are measured as separate economic activities rather than grouped with the economic activities of the soft drink plant, and the services provided by auxiliaries are now explicitly measured and treated as output. Auxiliary value added, intermediate purchases, and output are grouped with similar industry activity, and the auxiliary services are shown as purchases by the industries served. The important change is that the activities of the auxiliaries are grouped in industries with similar production processes.⁷

NAICS recognizes a new industry, "Management of companies and enterprises" (NAICS 5511). Most of the establishments in this new industry are CAO's. In addition, the 1997 Economic Census collected data on

12 types of auxiliaries in services, in transportation and warehousing, and in information.⁸ Most of these other auxiliaries are in "Professional, scientific, and technical services" (NAICS 54) and in "Administrative and support and waste management and remediation services" (NAICS 56).

The Economic Census also provided data for auxiliaries on the SIC-industry-served basis, but these data were only partial. For comparison, BEA used these data to prepare rough approximations of output, intermediate purchases, and value added on an SIC basis. The approximations used an average of the split between the value added and the intermediate purchases of the three largest auxiliaries to remove the NAICS treatment of auxiliaries. Although rough, these approximations provide a means of gauging the effects of the new treatment at an aggregate level and give an indication of the major shifts that have resulted. The results are discussed below and shown in table A.

The Input-Output Valuation of Transactions

Transactions in commodities are valued at producers' prices in the input-output (I-O) accounts. Producers' prices exclude wholesale and retail trade margins and transportation costs, but they include excise and sales taxes collected and remitted by producers. Transportation costs and trade margins are shown as separate purchases by the users of the commodities. The sum of the producers' value, transportation costs, and trade margins equals the purchasers' value.

In order to show the relationship between the production of commodities and their purchase by intermediate and final users, commodities are shown as if they move directly to users. The flows of commodities for resale to and from wholesale trade and retail trade are not shown. If trade were shown as buying and reselling commodities, industrial and final users would make most of their purchases from a single source—trade.

Wholesale and retail trade margins on commodities are shown as purchases by users and are included in the trade rows of use table 2 (rows 4200 and 4A00). Transportation costs are the freight charges paid to move the commodity from the producer to the intermediate user or the final user. All transportation costs are shown as a purchase by users and are included in the transportation rows of use table 2 (rows 4810 through 4840 and row 4860).

The *wholesale trade* sector comprises establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. (Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office.) The sector consists of two main types of wholesalers: Those that sell goods on their own account, and those that arrange sales and purchases for others for a commission or fee. Wholesale trade output consists of trade margin output and nonmargin output; both exclude the cost of goods purchased for resale. Both the margin and nonmargin outputs are included in the wholesale trade row of use table 2 (row 4200).

The trade margin output occurs when an establishment buys and resells the good. It is included in the purchasers' prices of the goods that are purchased but not in the producers' prices of those goods, and it is measured in two parts. For merchant wholesalers and for agents and brokers selling goods on their own account, the trade margin is calculated as wholesale sales less the cost of goods sold plus taxes collected by the distributor. For manufacturers' sales branches (wholesale trade establishments that primarily market goods manufactured by the same firm), it is calculated as expenses (excluding the cost of the goods) plus taxes collected by the sales branches.

Nonmargin output occurs when a wholesale trade service is purchased separately from the commodity, such as when a wholesaler acts as a broker between buyer and seller. Nonmargin output is assumed to be purchased by the producer of the goods being sold and is thus reflected in the producers' prices of the goods. It is measured as the sum of expenses (excluding the cost of the goods) on goods sold by manufacturers' sales offices, the commissions on goods sold by agents and brokers and by merchant wholesalers acting as commission merchants, the taxes

collected, and the customs duties, which are considered as taxes collected by wholesale trade establishments.

Retail trade has one primary product—distributive services for the sale of goods. Its output consists primarily of retail trade margins, which are measured as retail sales less the cost of goods sold plus the taxes collected by retail trade establishments. All retail trade margin and nonmargin output are included in the retail trade row of use table 2 (row 4A00).

Retail trade margins apply primarily to purchases by persons, but they are also applied to purchases by business and government, such as some purchases of personal computers by business. Retail trade margins are also applied to some intermediate purchases by business, such as office supplies, gasoline, and construction materials.

Imports of goods and services, a component of final uses, are measured by individual commodity at domestic port values. The domestic port value of an imported commodity, which includes customs duties, is considered equivalent to the producers' price of a domestically produced commodity. The imports of transportation and wholesale trade include adjustments to convert the sum of all commodity imports of goods to foreign port value.

Imports of services are valued at producers' prices. No margins or transportation costs are associated with services.

All imports except for "noncomparable imports" are assumed either to be consumed within the U.S. boundaries or to have domestic equivalents. Noncomparable imports consists of goods purchased by U.S. residents abroad and of services imports that have no domestic counterparts. These services include travel by U.S. residents abroad—both foreign travel by U.S. residents, which is included in final demand as a part of personal consumption expenditures, and foreign travel by U.S. business people, which is included as intermediate purchases. Noncomparable imports are distributed directly to industries and final users and are shown separately in use table 2 (row S003).

Exports of goods and services, a component of final uses, are measured by commodity at producers' prices—the same as other domestically produced commodities. Transportation costs and trade margins, which are required to move exports from the producer to the port of exit, are included in the transportation and trade rows of use table 2 (rows 4200, 4810 through 4840, and 4860).

Change in private inventories, a component of final uses, is measured by commodity at the LIFO-reserve-adjusted book value that is reported by industries in the economic census. The inventory valuation adjustment, which removes inventory profits or losses from total gross domestic product in the I-O accounts, is shown as a single entry in use table 2 (row S007, column F030).

Changes to intermediate purchases and to value added. The new treatment of auxiliaries raises total intermediate purchases and affects the industry distribution of value added. In the SIC-based classification, the services of auxiliaries are shown as intermediate purchases of goods and services, and the value added of the industries that used auxiliary services was higher than the NAICS treatment because it included compensation paid to the auxiliary's employees, indirect business tax and nontax liabilities paid by the auxiliary, and depreciation of the auxiliary's fixed capital. In the NAICS-based classification, the value-added components of an auxiliary are shown as the value added in the industries where they are classified.

As a result of the new classification, total intermediate purchases were \$6,517 billion, or about 5 percent higher than in the SIC. The \$340 billion increase represents the amount of industry purchases of the new auxiliary services (table A). Total value added in the economy remained the same, but value added across industries changed.

In the goods-producing sectors, value added decreased because the value-added components of auxiliary services were moved, and intermediate purchases increased (chart 1). The largest impact was on manufacturing compensation, which dropped more than \$100 billion. In the services-providing sectors, as a result of the new auxiliary treatment, especially the addition of the industry "management of companies and enterprises," both value added and intermediate purchases were raised. The higher value added in the services-providing sectors was equal to the amount of auxiliary compensation, indirect business tax and nontax liabilities, and depreciation that was moved from the goods-producing industries.

Changes to gross output. As a result of treating auxiliaries as output-producing establishments in the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts, total gross output was \$14,863 billion, or 2.3 percent higher than in the SIC (table A). The \$340 billion increase, the same as the increase in total intermediate purchases, was almost entirely accounted for by three auxiliaries:

- Corporate, subsidiary, and regional managing offices,
- Auxiliary scientific research and development, and
- Auxiliary warehousing and storage.

Other NAICS changes


The 1997 benchmark I-O estimates include several additional classification changes as a result of incorporating NAICS. Establishments are now grouped according to the similarities of their production

processes rather than the similarities of their products. The largest of these additional changes were the following:

- The new "information" sector was created by combining industries from manufacturing, services, and transportation, communication, and utilities.
- Transportation, communication, and utilities was split into three sectors.
- The new "real estate and rental and leasing" sector was broken out of "finance, insurance, and real estate" and services.
- Services are shown with a breakdown according to their production processes, including "professional, scientific, and technical services," "administrative and waste management services," "educational services," "health care and social assistance," "arts, entertainment, and recreation," and "accommodation and food services."

For a description of these changes that resulted from NAICS and their effects, see table B.

The Input-Output Classification Systems

The input-output (I-O) accounts use two classification systems, both of which generally use the same I-O codes and titles (see appendixes A and B). In the I-O *industry* classification system, output typically represents the total output of all establishments in each industry, regardless of whether the commodities produced are primary to the industry (that is, make up the largest proportion of the establishment's output) or are secondary (that is, primary to another industry). In the I-O *commodity* classification system, output represents the total output of the product or service, regardless of the classification of the establishments that produce it.

The I-O industry classification system. The I-O system is based on the official U.S. classification system, which for 1997 is the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). NAICS classifies establishments into industries on the basis of the similarities of their production processes. In the previously used Standard Industrial Classification system, establishments are classified into industries on the basis of the similarities of their products.

The I-O industry classification system for 1997 generally applies to both the standard make and use tables and the supplementary make and use tables and requirements tables. For the supplementary make and use tables and requirements tables, industries are modified by redefining or moving some secondary products and their inputs from the industries in which they are produced to those in which they are primary (see the box "Treatment of Secondary Products" on page 27).

However, the I-O industry classification system includes "special industries" (industries or commodities) and "government industries" that are not considered industries in NAICS. Furthermore, because of data limitations, the I-O industry system includes three industries—agriculture, construction, and real estate—that are defined on an activity basis rather than on an establishment basis.

"Special industries" consists of noncomparable imports; scrap, used and secondhand goods; a rest-of-the-world adjustment to final uses; and an inventory valuation adjustment. I-O special industries are incorporated to maintain consistency with economic concepts underlying the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

"Government industries" include government enterprises (Federal and State and local) and general government, which generally corresponds to the NAICS classification for Public Administration (NAICS Sector 92).

"Activity-based" industries are used for agriculture, construction, and real estate. Agriculture industries are classified by commodity, such as grain farming products, because the quality of the source data on the production of agriculture commodities is believed to be better than that of the data available by type of establishment or farm.

Construction is classified by type of activity, such as the construction of new highways and streets, rather than by the type of construction contractor, such as heavy construction

contractors who pave asphalt roads. Construction is classified by type of activity because the estimates rely heavily on the value-put-in-place statistics.

The real estate industry consists of all real estate rental receipts and all imputed rents for owner-occupied housing and for buildings and equipment owned and used by nonprofit institutions primarily serving households. Rental receipts are included in one industry because of the lack of data on rents received by individual industries. Imputed rents are included so the I-O accounts will be consistent with the NIPA's.

"Redefinitions" apply only to the industries in the supplementary make and use tables and requirements tables. As a result of these redefinitions, outputs and inputs related to the secondary activities of some industries are shifted to the industries in which they are primary activities. Only the secondary activities of industries for which the related inputs differ significantly from those required for the primary activities are redefined. For example, both the output and related inputs of fullservice restaurants in hotels and motels have been moved from the "hotels and motels" industry (in which "lodging services" is the primary activity) to the "food services and drinking places" industry (in which "eating and drinking" is the primary activity) because the input structure of "food and beverages" differs significantly from that of "lodging services." As a result of this shift, the total outputs for the "food services and drinking places" industry and the "hotels and motels" industry in the supplementary make and use tables differ from those in the standard tables (appendix F). (However, total outputs for the I-O *commodities* are the same in the two sets of tables.)

The I-O commodity classification system. In this system, each commodity is assigned the code of the industry in which the commodity is the primary product. This code is then used to group the production of the commodity in the industry in which it is the primary product with its production in other industries in which it is a secondary product. In a few cases, the I-O system reclassifies NAICS-defined commodity groups, and a secondary product is created from a NAICS-defined primary product. The output of the NAICS-defined product is moved (reclassified) to the I-O-defined primary product group; therefore, the output represents the total output of the product, regardless of the classification of the establishments that produce it.

In NAICS, for example, the primary product of the newspaper publishers industry is defined as newspaper sales and newspaper advertising. In the I-O commodity system, the primary product of the newspaper publishers industry is newspaper sales. The advertising component is considered to be a secondary activity, so advertising receipts (output) are moved to the advertising commodity group. The total output for the I-O newspaper publishers *industry* remains unchanged, but the output of the newspaper *commodity* is reduced, and the output of the advertising *commodity* is increased.

The use of data that are classified by activity rather than by industry to derive estimates for the agriculture and construction industries, and the inclusion of all real estate rental receipts in the real estate industry regardless of the industry that receives them, reflect inconsistencies with the production-based orientation of NAICS.

Other Improvements to the 1997 Benchmark I-O Accounts

Additional changes in classification, methodology, and presentation were introduced in the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts. These changes, many of which are related to investment activities, include the following.

- Featured I-O tables now have industry definitions that are more consistent with the GDP-by-industry accounts. This change is part of BEA's effort to further integrate its economic accounts. In the GDP-by-industry accounts, new construction by industries of their own facilities is included in industry output but maintenance and repair construction by industries on their own facilities is not. In the featured I-O tables, these expenditures are treated the same way.
- Improved treatment of software. In the 1999 NIPA comprehensive revision, BEA introduced the treatment of software as investment; previously, expenditures on software were treated as intermediate purchases. In the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts, software is treated consistently as investment, and additional improvements are introduced, including the capitalization of software originals used for reproduction, the use of more detailed occupational data in estimating own-account software produced by industries, and a more direct calculation of the total costs of producing own-account software.
- Interactive software tool. A new tool is now available on BEA's Web site that enables users to interactively select and format data from the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts.
- •Other major improvements. New definitions of output have been introduced for computer systems integrators as part of the industry "computer systems design services" and for the industry "natural gas distribution." The presentation of the requirements tables has been expanded to include an industry-by-industry total requirements table for estimating the linkages between industries from changes in final uses.

Changes related to investment

Own-account new construction. Own-account new construction, or "force-account" construction, refers to construction activities performed by businesses, government, or persons for themselves rather than purchased from construction businesses. In the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts, it is treated as being produced by the industries in which the own-account new construction occurs and then "purchased" in final uses.

In the 1997 standard make and use tables, own-account new construction, including output and all in-

puts, is now shown as a secondary product of the industry in which the activity occurs. Previously, own-account construction was reassigned to the new-construction industry and included as part of its primary production. For home-owners, own-account new construction is now shown in the owner-occupied dwellings industry. For government, it is now shown in the general government industry.

The change in treatment does not affect total gross output and total final uses. It facilitates comparisons of the data in the standard make and use tables with other industry data, such as industry series from the GDP-by-industry accounts.

In the supplementary make and use tables, the activities of own-account new construction are still shown as part of the new-construction industry, as they were in the 1992 benchmark I-O accounts. See the box "Treatment of Secondary Products."

Own-account maintenance and repair construction. In the standard and the supplementary make and use tables, own-account maintenance and repair construction is no longer treated as output. This change reduces total gross output, but it does not affect total final uses and total value added, the alternative measures of total economic activity. This change is intended to facilitate comparisons of data from the I-O accounts with other statistical data on industries. Previously, own-account maintenance and repair activities were treated as secondary products of the originating industries and included in the maintenance and repair construction industry.

Software. The capitalization of software has been introduced into the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts. Three types of software—prepackaged software, custom software, and own-account software—are now treated as investment. For previous benchmark I-O accounts estimates, only software that was bundled with, or embedded in, equipment by the producer of that equipment was included in investment.

BEA introduced the capitalization of software into the national income and product accounts during the 1999 comprehensive revision of those accounts.¹¹ In this benchmark, BEA has also made several measurement improvements discussed below.

Own-account software is now treated similarly to own-account new construction. It is shown as a secondary product of the originating industry in the standard make and use tables, and it is shown as part of the primary production of the software industry in the

Treatment of Secondary Products

For the purposes of data collection, an establishment or a business unit is assigned to an "industry" according to its output and production process. However, most establishments produce more than one product, so the establishment is categorized by its primary source of revenue or its *primary product*. The other products that the establishment produces are identified as *secondary products*. For example, a hotel may also provide restaurant services, but these services are not part of the hotel industry's primary product of lodging, so they are treated as a secondary product of the hotel industry.

In BEA's "standard" make and use tables, all of the products—primary and secondary—that are produced by an industry are assigned to that industry. As a result, the data in these tables are consistent with the industry-based data that are collected and reported by other statistical agencies.

In the "supplementary" make and use tables, some of the secondary products are reassigned to the industries in which these products are primary products. The data in these tables and in the total requirements tables that are derived from them are valuable for performing economic structural analysis, impact analysis, and other types of economic modeling.

In traditional I-O analysis, industries are required to have homogeneous production processes: Each industry produces only one commodity, and each commodity is produced by only one industry. Thus, secondary products present a special problem because they represent heterogeneity in an industry's output. In order to transform the make and use tables into the required format, assumptions about the technology of producing secondary products are needed. The two most commonly used technology assumptions are the industry-technology assumption and the commodity-technology assumption.

BEA developed a two-step process to reassign the secondary products from the industry in which they were produced to the industries in which these products are primary products.¹ The first step is referred to as the "redefinition process." In this step, it is assumed (1) that the input structure of a secondary product differs from the input structure of the primary product of the industry in which the secondary product was produced and (2)

that its input structure is similar to that of the primary product of the industry to which it is reassigned.²

As a result of the redefinition process, the total value of secondary products is decreased, and the total value of primary products is increased by the same amount. The following table summarizes the effects of this redefinition process on the detailed 1997 benchmark I-O make and use tables.

The amount of the redefined secondary output was \$465 billion, or 3.1 percent of total output and more than two-fifths of total secondary output. For most industries, the output shown in the standard make and use tables will differ from that shown in the supplementary make and use tables. The following industries were affected the most by these redefinitions: \$62 billion of auto repair was moved, mainly from retail trade, to "automotive repair and maintenance, except car washes"; \$48 billion of food services was moved, mainly from hotels, retail trade, and service industries, to "food services and drinking places"; \$46 billion of retail margin, primarily from service industries to "retail trade"; and \$46 billion of own account software, from most industries to "custom computer programming services."

In the second step, the remaining secondary products are reassigned so that each industry produces only its primary product. In this step, it is assumed that the input structure of each secondary product is similar to that of the primary product that the industry produces.³ This step is performed by the mathematical equations that are used to derive the three total requirements tables.⁴ This reassignment also affects a wide range of industries, including State and local government enterprises, manufacturing, "newspaper, book, and directory publishers," "radio and television broadcasting," and finance.

supplementary make and use tables. The measurement of own-account software in the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts has been improved by (1) the capitalization of software originals used for reproduction; (2) the use of more detailed occupational data in estimating own-account software produced by industries; and (3) the introduction of a more direct calculation of the total costs of producing own-account software.¹²

Purchased software estimates have been changed to include improved estimates of intermediate consumption of software and an expanded definition of exports and imports of software. New sources, including information from annual reports filed by software producers with the Securities and Exchange Commission, and professional judgment were used to supplement economic census data on purchased software embedded in, or bundled with, other equipment.

The definition of exports and imports of software was expanded to more accurately reflect international trade in software. Estimates for exports and imports of royalties and license fees for the rights to distribute, use, and reproduce computer software and of "other" private services for computer and information processing services are now reflected in the capitalized software estimates.

Computer systems integrators. Computer systems integrators plan and design computer systems that integrate computer hardware, software, and communication technologies for their customers. In the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts, this industry is treated as providing design, installation, and other services, and the value of all computer hardware and purchased software is now excluded from the gross output of the industry. The hardware and software installed by the computer systems integrators are now shown as being sold directly by the "computer and peripheral equipment manufacturing" and the "software publishing" industries to business and government as investment. Most of the output of systems integrators is also capitalized for the first time, and the remainder goes to other businesses as intermediate purchases.

In the 1992 benchmark accounts, the values of computer hardware and software in integrated systems were recorded as intermediate purchases and included as part of the gross output of systems integrators. Only the portion of their sales representing computer hardware were capitalized as investment.

Private equipment and software categories. BEA has implemented three major changes to the categories

of private equipment and software. First, the category for instruments has been divided into a category "medical equipment and instruments" and a category "nonmedical instruments." Second, the category for trucks, buses, and truck trailers has been divided into "light trucks" and "other trucks, buses, and truck trailers." Third, the category for tractors has been dropped, and its components have been distributed to "agricultural machinery," "construction machinery," and "other nonresidential equipment."

Change in definition for natural gas distribution

A new measure of gross output for natural gas distribution is introduced. In the 1992 benchmark accounts, output for natural gas distribution implicitly included resales in industry's sales. An analysis of the industry indicated that much of the growth in output for the industry that was reported in the 1997 Economic Census was due to resales of natural gas within the industry. In the 1997 benchmark accounts, the gross output measure of natural gas distribution is net of an estimated value for these resales.

Changes in presentation

Three changes in presentation are introduced. First, the software tool available on BEA's Web site will allow users to interactively select and format data that they want to retrieve from the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts. Second, the standard make and use tables are now the featured I-O tables. Third, a new industry-by-industry total requirements table is added to the commodity-by-commodity total requirements table and the industry-by-commodity total requirements table that have been provided in the past. (See also the box "Data Availability" on page 38.)

Web-based tool for customizing tables. In response to requests from users, BEA's Web site now features an interactive software tool that enables users to interactively select and customize data from the I-O accounts. Using this software, users can easily select, preview, and download subsets of data at the detailed, summary, or sector levels and valued in producers' prices or purchasers' prices. Additional features include a search engine for finding a specified industry or commodity and a tool that can be used to transpose columns and rows of data.

Presentation of standard make and use tables. The standard make and use tables conform closely to the official classification system used by the statistical agencies that collect and report data. For the 1997 benchmark accounts, these tables are on a NAICS basis; for the 1992 benchmark accounts, they were on a SIC basis. The availability of these tables on a NAICS basis makes it easier for users to compare data from the I-O accounts with other industry-based data series, and it is an important step in moving towards greater consistency between the I-O accounts and the GDP-by-industry and gross state product accounts.

Industry-by-industry total requirements table. For the 1997 benchmark, BEA has prepared an industryby-industry total requirements table in addition to its other total requirements tables. The new table can be used to analyze the linkages between industries that result from changes in final demand.

Compilation of the 1997 Benchmark I-O Accounts

An important feature of the accounting framework of the U.S. benchmark I-O tables, and of its underlying NAICS-based classification system, is its compatibility with basic accounting records. However, the source data reported by businesses and by other transactors in the economy must be transformed into a consistent, comprehensive set of I-O tables. In addition, because the available accounting records do not provide sufficient information for some parts of the accounts, BEA has to identify other data sources and estimating methods for the estimates.

BEA prepared the 1997 benchmark I-O accounts in seven steps:

- (1) Developed a consistent classification framework that could be used for presenting the tables on a NAICS basis and for linking backwards with the aid of concordances to the source data that are still on an SIC basis or that use other classification systems,
- (2) Estimated the output for each industry and commodity, which formed the basis for the I-O make table,
- (3) Estimated the intermediate and value-added inputs required by each industry to produce its output,
- (4) Estimated the domestic supply of each commodity—that is, the total value of goods and services available for consumption as intermediate inputs by industries or as final uses,
- (5) Estimated the components of final uses for which more direct information was unavailable, using the commodity-flow method,
- (6) Estimated wholesale and retail trade margins, transportation costs, and excise and sales taxes in order to convert all transactions by final and intermediate

users from the prices received by producers to the prices paid by purchasers,

(7) Balanced the tables by resolving the larger discrepancies in the I-O use table with further analysis and judgmental changes and then allocating the smaller discrepancies; any final residual was allocated to the "other value added" component of value added.

Development of a classification framework. The 1997 benchmark I-O tables are based on NAICS, but some of the source data used in their preparation were not available on that basis. Because the statistical agencies and other providers of the source data are converting from the SIC system to NAICS over several years, data from several sources had to be mapped from an SIC basis to a NAICS basis. In addition, commodities—whether produced by domestic industries or imported from other countries, whether transported by truck, rail, air, or water, and whether used as inputs by industries or as final uses—had to be classified consistently. Moreover, the classification system used for certain sets of data, such as the Harmonized System for foreign trade and the codes from the economic census for materials consumed by manufacturing and mining industries, typically reflect that system's history and original purpose. Because of the massive changes in classification that were made in this benchmark, considerable effort was required to prepare concordances or mappings for the conversion of all of the data to a common basis. In addition, whenever possible, concordances between the codes used for the 1992 benchmark accounts and the new codes used for the 1997 benchmark accounts were prepared. These concordances document the changes and provide a limited guide for comparing the 1997 benchmark tables with the tables of previous benchmarks.

Estimation of industry and commodity outputs. First, BEA estimated output and then prepared the I-O make table, which shows the commodities produced by each industry and all the industries producing each commodity. The outputs of most commodities and industries were based on receipts and shipments data collected in the 1997 Economic Census by the Census Bureau or in the case of agriculture, by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Table C provides a list of the sectors covered by the economic census and the other principal data sources used by BEA to estimate the outputs for commodities and industries.

The economic census covers most establishments, but it does not directly cover businesses without employees, such as real estate agents and independent "mom and pop" operations that are generally small. BEA prepared the estimates for these businesses using nonemployer data from the Census Bureau; these data are based on administrative records of the Internal

These industries include information; professional, scientific and technical services; administrative and support services; vocational educational services; health care and social assistance; arts, entertainment, and recreation; accommodation and food services; other services; retail trade; and wholesale trade.

I-O Input-output

Revenue Service (IRS), primarily from sole proprietorship businesses filing IRS Form 1040, Schedule C. BEA adjusted the IRS data to account for late filers and nonfilers and for filers who have misreported receipts.

The following industries are among those not covered by the economic census: Large certificated passenger air transportation and rail transportation in the sector "transportation and warehousing"; veterinary services in "professional and technical services"; landscaping services in "administrative and waste services"; private elementary and secondary schools and private colleges and universities in "educational services"; and religious organizations, labor unions, political organizations, and private households that employ workers for the operation of the household in "other services." For these industries, BEA used data from other sources—such as the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Department of Transportation, U.S. Department of Treasury, Office of Management and Budget, other Government agencies, and private organizations many of which are identified in table C.

The estimates of output for some industries and commodities are based on imputations. Examples include own-account software, the rental value of owner-occupied housing, and financial services provided without direct charges by financial institutions.

Estimation of industry intermediate and value-added inputs. As shown in table D, most of the detailed data available to estimate commodity inputs were also from the 1997 Economic Census. When only aggregate data for expenses were available, BEA combined that information (for example, purchases of fuel by manufacturing industries) with information on purchases of individual commodities (for example, purchases of petroleum products, natural gas, and coal in purchased fuels) to estimate the purchases of specific commodities by an industry (for example, purchases of natural gas by a manufacturing industry).

BEA also estimated intermediate inputs for which no direct information was available. For example, detailed economic census data are available for the materials and supplies used by manufacturing industries, but the data only covered part of their purchased services. The estimates of the remaining inputs were extrapolated from the 1992 benchmark estimates by the change in industry output from 1992 to 1997.

In the I-O accounts, value added consists of three components—compensation of employees, indirect business tax and nontax liability, and "other value added." The first two components were estimated from a variety of data sources (the principal ones are shown in table D). Total compensation of employees from the NIPA's was allocated to industries on the basis of economic census data. Total indirect business tax and

nontax liability from the NIPA's was allocated to industries in two parts. For general sales and excise taxes, the values were incorporated as part of each industry's output on the basis of information from census annual surveys for sales taxes and from the GDP-by-industry accounts for excise taxes; for other indirect business taxes, such as property taxes, estimates were allocated on the basis of a variety of source data, including State government tax collections and highway statistics. Depreciation, a part of "other value added," was estimated for auxiliaries and government industries. ("Other value added" for other industries is derived as a residual by subtracting total intermediate inputs, compensation of employees, and indirect business tax and nontax liability from total industry output in the final step of balancing the table.)

Estimation of domestic supply. The domestic supply of each commodity is the total value of goods and services available for consumption as intermediate inputs by industries or as personal consumption expenditures (PCE), private fixed investment, and government consumption and gross investment expenditures. It was calculated as domestic commodity output plus government sales and imports less exports and change in private inventories. Government sales, such as sales of school lunches, were based on data from the NIPA's. Exports and imports were based on foreign trade statistics from the Census Bureau and on data from BEA's international transactions accounts. Because domestic supply is measured in producers' prices, transportation costs and wholesale trade margins were subtracted from exports before the final calculation. BEA estimated the 1997 change in private inventories by commodity on the basis of economic census data and of information on corporate inventories by industry from the IRS.

Estimation of other final uses. The estimates of final uses of the Federal Government and of State and local government were based on the estimates of total consumption and investment expenditures by type of purchase from the NIPA's. These estimates were then allocated to I-O commodities based on professional judgment and on information from the 1997 Census of Governments, Federal budget data, and government agency reports.

The estimates of many commodities in PCE and in private equipment and software were prepared using the commodity-flow method. In this method, government expenditures for, and intermediate purchases by businesses of, a commodity are subtracted from its domestic supply in order to obtain a residual that reflects purchases by persons for consumption or by businesses for investment. For example, using this method, purchases of cereal for PCE were estimated as a 100-

percent residual.

The estimates of the other commodities used a variation of the commodity-flow method in which a percentage of domestic supply was allocated to PCE or to private equipment and software expenditures. Many of these percentages were based on class-of-customer data from the 1997 Economic Census or from information developed from alternative sources, such as trade associations, private businesses, and other government agencies. For example, using class-of-customer data from the economic census, purchases of tax return preparation services for PCE were estimated as 91 percent of domestic supply.

The estimates of residential and nonresidential structures in gross private fixed investment were generally based on information from the NIPA's and from the Census Bureau's data on value of construction put in place. Estimates of oil and gas well drilling and new access structures for solid mineral development and of manufactured mobile structures were based on 1997 Economic Census data.¹⁴

Estimation of trade margins, transportation costs, and excise and sales taxes. To estimate the cost of transporting commodities from producers to users, BEA first estimated all transportation services bought and sold in the economy by mode-that is, by rail, truck, water, air, and pipeline. Total transportation receipts for each mode were then separated into receipts from travel by persons, such as household consumers' purchases of airline services for vacation travel, and receipts from the transport of goods, such as mining operators' shipping coal by rail. The receipts for moving goods were allocated to commodities by mode: For rail, the allocation was based on information from the American Association of Railroads; for air, from the U.S. Department of Transportation; and for all other modes, from the Census Bureau's 1997 Commodity Flow Survey. For transportation margins on pipeline transmissions, BEA used data directly from the 1997 Economic Census.

The estimates of wholesale and retail trade margins were based on output data from the 1997 Economic Census, supplemented by information from the 1997 Annual Trade Survey and the 1997 Annual Retail Trade Survey. Margin output was then allocated to commodities, using information on sales for major commodity lines by type of business (for example, sales of kitchen appliances by household appliance stores) also from the economic census.

The estimates of sales and excise taxes were based on

information from the Census Bureau's annual trade surveys and from the NIPA's.

Final balancing of the tables. The final step was to resolve any discrepancies that caused inequalities between the domestic supply of a commodity and its disposition to intermediate and final users. These discrepancies occur for many reasons, including misreporting and misclassification of data from sources; improper valuation and timing of production, exports and imports, and other final uses; and inconsistences and gaps in the source data. In this step, BEA analyzed the sources of the larger discrepancies to determine possible solutions. The remaining smaller discrepancies were then allocated to likely users based on information from the 1992 benchmark I-O accounts. The remaining imbalances in the table were allocated to "other value added" of industries.

Technical Note: The 1997 Benchmark Input-Output Accounts Tables

The 1997 benchmark input-output (I-O) accounts are presented in the standard make and use tables and several supplementary tables. ¹⁵ The supplementary tables consist of make and use tables that are based on the standard tables, four requirements tables, and bridge tables. ¹⁶

Standard tables

The standard make and use tables are based on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). They are constructed before the redefinitions of selected secondary products (see the box "Treatment of Secondary Products" on page 27). These standard tables provide data in a way that is consistent with the GDP-by-industry accounts and the gross state product accounts and with other industry data that are based on information collected on the NAICS basis.

Table 1, the standard make table. The standard make table is a matrix that shows the value in producers' prices of each commodity produced by each industry (see the schematic in the upper panel of chart 2 and with estimates in table E). In the matrix, commodities are presented in the columns, and industries are presented in the rows. The entries in a row represent the dollar value of commodities produced by the industry at the beginning of the row. The entries in a column represent the value of the production by each industry

of the commodity at the top of the column.

The diagonal cell in each row (a shaded cell in chart 2) shows the value of production of the commodity for which the industry has been designated the "primary" producer. Any entries in the other cells in the row show the value of production of commodities for which other industries are the primary producers (and for which the given industry is a "secondary" producer).

The row total in the make table is total industry output, and the column total is total commodity output. As indicated by the shading in chart 2, the row totals of the make table equal the column totals of the use table, and the column totals of the make table equal the row totals of the use table.

Table 2, the standard use table. The standard use table is a matrix that shows the commodities consumed, or used, by each industry and final consumer (see the schematic in the lower panel of chart 2 and with estimates in table F). The entries in a row represent the dollar value of the use by each industry of the commodity named at the beginning of the row and of the sales of the commodity to final uses. The industry uses add up to total intermediate use (the far right column of the industries' portion in chart 2). The final uses sum to GDP (the far right column of the finaluses' portion in chart 2). The entries in a column represent the value of the commodities—that is, of raw materials, semifinished products, and services—used and the value added that is generated in production by the industry at the top of the column. The row total (total commodity output) is the production of the commodity (no matter which industry contributed to that production), and the column total (total industry output) is the production of the industry (no matter what commodity was produced).

Supplementary tables

The supplementary make and use tables are based on the standard make and use tables. The estimates in the supplementary make and use tables are used to calculate four requirements tables—commodity-by-industry direct requirements, commodity-by-commodity total requirements, industry-by-commodity total requirements, and industry-by-industry total requirements—that quantify the direct and indirect effects of changes in final demand on the economy (see the box "Treatment of Secondary Products"). These requirements tables are an important analytical tool because they show the interdependence among the producers and consumers in the economy. Using these tables, analysts can estimate the direct and indirect effects of changes in final uses on industries and commodities. For example, these tables can be used to determine the economic impact of a disaster or to compute the effect on output of a shift in demand from domestic to imported goods.

Three additional supplementary tables serve as bridges between the I-O estimates and estimates in the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

Tables 3 and 4, the supplementary make and use tables. Except for the treatment of redefinitions of selected secondary products produced by industries, these make and use tables are in the same format as the standard make and use tables.

Table 5, the commodity-by-industry direct requirements table. This table is derived from the use table by relating commodity input for an industry to the industry's output. The values in this table, referred to as the "direct requirements coefficients," show the amount of a commodity required by the industry to produce a dollar of the industry's output.

Table 8, the industry-by-industry total requirements table. This table is also derived from both the make and use tables. The values in this table, referred to as "industry-by-industry total requirements coefficients," show the production required directly and indirectly from the industry at the beginning of the row per dollar of delivery to final use by the industry at the top of the column.

personal consumption expenditures. The second table (appendix D) covers the I-O commodity composition of NIPA private equipment and software expenditures. The third table (appendix E) reconciles the I-O estimates of exports and imports with those in the NIPA's.

The commodity composition tables are necessary because the valuations and definitions used in the I-O accounts differ from those used in the NIPA's. In the I-O accounts, the final use categories are expressed in producers' prices; in the NIPA's, final demand categories are expressed in purchasers' prices. In addition, the definitions of the export and import components of I-O final use categories differ from those of the NIPA final demand categories. Before the I-O total requirements tables can be used to measure and analyze the changes in commodity or industry output require-

ments that result from changes in the level or composition of NIPA final demand, the NIPA final demand categories must be converted to the I-O final use categories; that is, the analysis should be consistent with I-O final use commodities that are valued at producers' prices for the I-O year and include separate entries for transportation costs and trade margins.

Some adjustments are necessary in order to reconcile the I-O estimates of exports and imports of goods and services with those in the NIPA's. In the NIPA's—unlike the I-O accounts—imports include the U.S. merchandise that is returned to the United States from other countries, and exports include the foreign merchandise that is reexported from the United States to other countries. The same adjustments are made for both exports and imports, so total GDP is not affected.
