Dear Sir or Madam:

Kindly accept this letter as formal notification that the Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC") has submitted to the Court, in the above-captioned matter, a motion for a proposed distribution plan for customers of Defendants Ben Ouyang and Victco Financial Services, Inc. (collectively, "Defendants").

On July 19, 2006, Judge Dale S. Fischer issued an Amended Order Approving Proposed Distribution Plan ("Order"). In the Order, the Court directed the CFTC to mail, on or before August 18, 2006, notification which includes the CFTC's motion, the exhibits thereto and the July 19 Order, to all 152 persons who filed a claim pursuant to the Claims Process Order. Those documents are enclosed herein and can also be accessed from the website, www.cftc.gov, by clicking the Related Links tab, and then the Customer Protection link.

Pursuant to the Order, you have until **SEPTEMBER 15, 2006**, to submit **IN WRITING**, any **COMMENTS OR OBJECTIONS TO THE MOTION**. As further directed by the Court, all **COMMENTS OR OBJECTIONS TO THE MOTION** must be **IN WRITING** and sent to CFTC attorney, David Acevedo, on or before **SEPTEMBER 15, 2006**. For your convenience, we have enclosed a Business Reply envelope (postage paid) with Mr. Acevedo's name and address.

On or before September 22, 2006, the CFTC will file with the Court any written comments or objections it receives. The CFTC will have until October 13, 2006, to file with the Court a written response to any comments or objections to the proposed distribution plan. Copies of the CFTC's response shall be sent to all who submitted a claim.

Thereafter, the Court shall set a hearing date in consultation with the CFTC and Defendants' counsel. A hearing shall be held, on notice to Defendants and to all who submitted a claim, for the Court to rule on the proposed plan and any objections to it.
