## On The Map Updates and Pricing

**On The Map** version 1.0 based on 2002-2003 data was officially released as a pilot on February 3, 2006. Two maintenance updates to the web-based application are scheduled for 2006. The primary purpose of the updates is to fix identified bugs, keep the content current, ensure compliance with new rules and regulations, and implement basic planned enhancements to version 1.0:

Version 1.1 – scheduled release on May 31, 2006

- Clickable U.S. State Map on the Place Name Lookup page
- Improved legend, layer selection, and labeling functionality
- Additional online documentation and help screens

Version 1.2 – scheduled release on October 31, 2006

• Improved recall of session history

Relatively minor bug fixes and general content updates will be implemented on an as-needed basis and released as sub-subversion 1.x.x during the year.

## How States May Join On The Map Based on 2002-2003 Data

- Must be a member of the Local Employment Dynamics (LED) partnership
- Provide funds of \$30,000 at the start and an additional \$30,000 at the completion
- Provide mapping layer information in digital form (One Stop Centers, Colleges and Training Centers, and Economic Development Regions)
- Allow implementation in up to 2 months; large states may require more time

## How States May Renew On The Map Based on 2004 Data

- Must be an existing pilot member for On The Map 2002-2003 data
- Provide funds of \$15,000 at the start and an additional \$15,000 at the completion
- Initial production will begin with a minimum of 5 states
- Allow implementation in up to 5 months; large states may require more time
- Will include all cross-state patterns as default

New features and functionalities may be added to future versions of On The Map, and new applications using the data infrastructure may also be developed, pending on the level of additional funding.
