ORDER OF DISMISSAL

All of the respondents are in default.¹ Still, when we established a deadline for complainant India Moss-Thomas to move for a default judgment,² she declined to seek the relief. Thus, on December 5, 2007, we scheduled a hearing³ and, six days later, Moss-Thomas filed a notice of intent to participate in the proceeding.⁴ However, on January 17, 2008, the complainant filed a letter stating that she will not attend the hearing.⁵ Because Moss-Thomas has
