The National File Tracking System (NFTS) was developed to better track alien file (A-File) location information and improve data quality and achieve operational efficiencies. NFTS supports the PARTed program, Immigration Services, by supporting the delivery of timely, accurate, and complete information to adjudicators, investigators, inspectors, and border patrol agents. NFTS supports the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) mission by seeking to reduce the immigration benefit backlog and improve customer service through streamlined processes and upgraded A-File tracking. This enhances national security in that federal, state, and local governments have access to alien file data contained within NFTS. In Fiscal Year 2006 (FY06) the National Benefits Center (NBC) began using NFTS. NFTS supports business goals by providing efficient access to high quality immigrant information through maintaining accurate file inventory and location information. USCIS is refining its strategy for an enterprise-wide transformation of its Information Technology (IT) Systems. NFTS, as a mission critical system, will be integrated into this initiative. The deployment of a single web-enabled application minimizes system operations and maintenance costs to achieve maximum operational efficiencies. File requests and status changes can be updated within minutes, providing near real-time status with a web-enabled NFTS. Because NFTS provides a single repository of this information, there is no longer a need for reconciliations to ensure accurate accounting of file location data.
