TERM OF CONTRACT: The term of this contract is for the period beginning **Date of Award** and ending **November 30, 2009**, plus up to *four* (4) optional 12-month extension period(s) that may be added in accordance with the "Option to Extend the Term of the Contract" clause in Section 1 of this contract.

BID OPENING: Bids shall be publicly opened at 11 a.m., prevailing Washington, DC time, on December 1, 2008.

BID SUBMISSION: Submit bid in pre-addressed envelope furnished with solicitation, or send to: U.S. Government Printing Office, Bid Section, Room C-161, Stop PPSB, Washington, DC 20404. Facsimile bids in response to this solicitation are permitted. Facsimile bids may be submitted directly to the GPO Bid Section, FAX No. (202) 512-1782. The Program number and bid opening date must be specified with the bid. Refer to Facsimile Bids in Solicitation Provisions of GPO Contract Terms, GPO Publication 310.2 as revised June, 2001.

SPECIAL ATTENTION IS DIRECTED TO THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WHICH DIFFER SIGNIFICANTLY FROM THE PREVIOUS CONTRACT:

REMOVAL OF RESTRICTED RADIUS.

SECTION 1.- GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

GPO CONTRACT TERMS: Any contract which results from this Invitation for Bid will be subject to the applicable provisions, clauses, and supplemental specifications of GPO Contract Terms (GPO Pub. 310.2, effective December 1, 1987 (Rev. 6-01)) and GPO Contract Terms, Quality Assurance Through Attributes Program (GPO Pub. 310.1, effective May 1979 (revised August, 2002)).

QUALITY ASSURANCE LEVELS AND STANDARDS: The following levels and standards shall apply to these specifications:

Product Quality Levels:

- (a) Printing (page related) Attributes -- Level II.
- (b) Finishing (item related) Attributes -- Level II.

Inspection Levels (from ANSI/ASQC Z1.4):

- (a) Non-destructive Tests General Inspection Level I.
- (b) Destructive Tests Special Inspection Level S-2.

Specified Standards: The specified standards for the attributes requiring them shall be:

Special Instructions: In the event that inspection of press sheets is waived by the Government, the following listed alternate standards (in order of precedence) shall become the Specified Standards:

- P-7. Furnished disk/cartridge, average type dimension in publication.
- P-8. Furnished disk/cartridge.
- P-10. One piece laminated color proofs, Government furnished sample.

OPTION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE CONTRACT: The Government has the option to extend the term of this contract for a period of 12 months by written notice to the contractor not later than 30 days before the contract expires. If the Government exercises this option, the extended contract shall be considered to include this clause, except, the total duration of the contract may not exceed five years as a result of, and including, any extension(s) added under this clause. Further extension may be negotiated under the "Extension of Contract Term" clause. See also "Economic Price Adjustment" for authorized pricing adjustment(s).

EXTENSION OF CONTRACT TERM: At the request of the Government, the term of any contract resulting from this solicitation may be extended for such period of time as may be mutually agreeable to the GPO and the contractor.

ECONOMIC PRICE ADJUSTMENT: The pricing under this contract shall be adjusted in accordance with this clause, provided that in no event will any pricing adjustment be made that would exceed the maximum permissible under any law in effect at the time of the adjustment. There will be no adjustment for orders placed during the first period specified below. Pricing will thereafter be eligible for adjustment during the second and any succeeding performance period(s). For each performance period after the first, a percentage figure will be calculated as described below and that figure will be the economic price adjustment for that entire next period. Pricing adjustments under this clause are not applicable to reimbursable postage or transportation costs, or to paper, if paper prices are subject to adjustment by separate clause elsewhere in this contract.

For the purpose of this clause, performance under this contract will be divided into successive periods. The first period will extend from the December 1, 2008 to November 30, 2009, and the second and any succeeding period(s) will extend for 12 months from the end of the last preceding period, except that the length of the final period may vary. The first day of the second and any succeeding period(s) will be the effective date of the economic price adjustment for that period.

Pricing adjustments in accordance with this clause will be based on changes in the seasonally adjusted "Consumer Price Index For All Urban Consumers - Commodities Less Food" (Index) published monthly in the CPI Detailed Report by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The economic price adjustment will be the percentage difference between Index averages as specified in this paragraph. An index called the variable index will be calculated by averaging the monthly Indexes from the 12-month interval ending 3 months prior to the beginning of the period being considered for adjustment. This average is then compared to the average of the monthly Indexes for the 12-month interval ending August 31, 2008, called the base index. The percentage change (plus or minus) of the variable index from the base index will be the economic price adjustment for the period being considered for adjustment.

The Government will notify the contractor by contract modification specifying the percentage increase or decrease to be applied to invoices for orders placed during the period indicated. The contractor shall apply the percentage increase or decrease against the total price of the invoice less reimbursable postage or transportation costs and separately adjusted paper prices. Payment discounts shall be applied after the invoice price is adjusted.

ASSIGNMENT OF JACKETS, PURCHASE AND PRINT ORDERS: A GPO jacket number will be assigned and a purchase order issued to the contractor to cover work performed. The purchase order will be supplemented by an individual "Print Order" for each job placed with the contractor. The print order, when issued, will indicate the quantity to be produced and any other information pertinent to the particular order.

PREAWARD SURVEY: In order to determine the responsibility of the prime contractor or any subcontractor, the Government reserves the right to conduct an on-site pre-award survey at the contractor's/subcontractor's facility or to require other evidence of technical, production, managerial, financial, and similar abilities to perform, prior to the award of a contract

ORDERING: Items to be furnished under the contract shall be ordered by the issuance of print orders by the Government. Orders may be issued under the contract from December 1, 2008 through November 30, 2009 plus for such additional period(s) as the contract is extended. All print orders issued hereunder are subject to the terms and conditions of the contract. The contract shall control in the event of conflict with any print order. A print order shall be "issued" for purposes of the contract, when it is either deposited in the U.S. Postal Service mail or otherwise furnished to the contractor in conformance with the schedule.

REQUIREMENTS: This is a requirements contract for the items and for the period specified herein. Shipment/delivery of items or performance of work shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in accordance with the clause entitled "Ordering". The quantities of items specified herein are estimates only, and are not purchased hereby. Except as may be otherwise provided in this contract, if the Government's

requirements for the items set forth herein do not result in orders in the amounts or quantities described as "estimated" it shall not constitute the basis for an equitable price adjustment under this contract.

Except as otherwise provided in this contract, the Government shall order from the contractor all the items set forth which are required to be purchased by the Government activity identified on page 1.

The Government shall not be required to purchase from the contractor, requirements in excess of the limit on total orders under this contract, if any.

Orders issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that time shall be completed by the contractor within the time specified in the order, and the rights and obligations of the contractor and the Government respecting those orders shall be governed by the terms of this contract to the same extent as if completed during the effective period of this contract.

If shipment/delivery of any quantity of an item covered by the contract is required by reason of urgency prior to the earliest date that shipment/delivery may be specified under this contract, and if the contractor will not accept an order providing for the accelerated shipment/delivery, the Government may procure this requirement from another source.

The Government may issue orders which provide for shipment/delivery to or performance at multiple destinations.

Subject to any limitations elsewhere in this contract, the contractor shall furnish to the Government all items set forth herein which are called for by print orders issued in accordance with the "Ordering" clause of this contract.

SECTION 2.- SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE: These specifications cover the production of a self-covered newsletter requiring such operations as electronic prepress, printing in 4-color process, binding, packing, and distribution.

TITLE: National Wildlife Refuge System Newsletter and Friends Forward Newsletter.

FREQUENCY OF ORDERS: Approximately 8 - 10 orders per year.

QUANTITY: Approximately 1,500 to 11,000 copies per order.

NUMBER OF PAGES: Approximately 8 to 32 pages per order.

TRIM SIZE: 8-1/2 x 11".

GOVERNMENT TO FURNISH:

Electronic Media:

Platform: Macintosh Model using System 9.0 or higher.

Storage Media: CD-ROM.

Software: Adobe InDesign CS 3, Adobe Illustrator CS3 or higher and Adobe Photoshop CS3 or higher. Files are supplied in Native Application Format.

Note: All software upgrades (for specified applications) which may occur during the term of the contract, must be supported by the contractor.

Fonts: All printer and screen fonts will be furnished.

The contractor is cautioned that furnished fonts are the property of the Government and/or its contractor(s). All furnished fonts are to be eliminated from the contractor's archive immediately after completion of the contract.

Mailing list furnished on CD-ROM, in ASCII format, compiled in Excel software, containing approximately 1,500 to 6,000 names and addresses for addressing self-mailers.

Camera Copy furnished for the Standard Presort U.S. Postal Service Permit Imprint is to be retained by the contractor for use in subsequent newsletters.

A supply of blue labels and selection certificates for shipping Departmental Random copies.

One reproduction proof, Form 905 (R. 3/90) with labeling and marking specifications.

Identification markings such as register marks, ring folios, rubber stamped jacket numbers, commercial identification marks of any kind, etc., except GPO imprint, form number, and revision date, carried on electronic files, must not print on finished product.

CONTRACTOR TO FURNISH: All materials and operations, other than those listed under "Government to Furnish," necessary to produce the product(s) in accordance with these specifications.

ELECTRONIC PREPRESS: Prior to image processing, the contractor shall perform a basic check (preflight) of the furnished media and publishing files to assure correct output of the required reproduction image. Any errors, media damage, or data corruption that might interfere with proper file image processing must be reported to Pete Maccini, (703) 358-2196.

The contractor shall create or alter any necessary trapping, set proper screen angles and screen frequency, and define output selection for the imaging device being utilized. Furnished files must be imaged as necessary to meet the assigned quality level.

When required by the Government, the contractor shall make minor revisions to the electronic files. It is anticipated that the Government will make all major revisions.

Prior to making revisions, the contractor shall copy the furnished files and make all changes to the copy.

Upon completion of each order, the contractor must furnish final production native application files (digital deliverables) with the furnished material. The digital deliverables must be an exact representation of the final printed product and shall be returned on the same type of storage media as was originally furnished. The Government will not accept, as digital deliverables, PostScript files, Adobe Acrobat Portable Document Format (PDF) files, or any proprietary files formats other than those supplied, unless specified by the Government.

PROOFS: Two (2) sets of one-piece laminated color proofs, or equal for color/press accuracy of all pages. At contractor's option, digital color proofs (Kodak Approval, Screen TrueRite, or similar) with a minimum resolution of 2400 dpi may be furnished. Proofs will be used for color match on the press.

These proofs must have all elements in proper position. The proofs should have color control bars, tint patches and dot gain scale (such as, Brunner, GATF, GRETAG, or RIT) repeated across sheet. If digital proofs are provided, the make and model number of the proofing system utilized shall be furnished with the proofs.

The U.S. Government Printing Office reserves the right to require samples and to judge the suitability of any digital proof offered. If the samples are disapproved by the Government, the contractor will be required to submit analog proofs in accordance with the contract.

Proofs shall consist of complete signatures with all illustrations in proper position (not pasted up), and all pages imposed in correct location, exposed face and back, folded and trimmed to the finished size of the product.

Contractor must call GPO Contract compliance Section at (202) 512-0520 immediately upon sending/delivering proofs and immediately upon notification that the proofs are available for pickup at the department. Proofs will be withheld not more than 1 workday from receipt in the department until they are made available for pickup by the contractor. CONTRACTOR MUST NOT PRINT PRIOR TO RECEIVING AN "OK TO PRINT".

If any contractor's errors are serious enough in the opinion of the GPO to require revised proofs, the revised proofs are to be provided at no expense to the Government. No extra time can be allowed for this reproofing; such operations must be accomplished within the original production schedule allotted in the specifications.

The contractor must not print prior to receipt of an "OK to print."

An occasional order will require revised proofs.

STOCK/PAPER: The specifications of all paper furnished must be in accordance with those listed herein or listed for the corresponding JCP Code numbers in the "Government Paper Specification Standards No. 11" dated February 1999.

All paper used in each copy must be of a uniform shade.

White Matte Coated Offset Book, basis weight: 80 lbs. per 500 sheets, 25 x 38", equal to JCP Code A240.

PRINTING: Prints head-to-head in four-color process.

PRESS SHEET INSPECTION: Final makeready press sheets may be inspected and approved at the contractor's plant for the purpose of establishing specified standards for use during the actual press run. Upon approval of the sheets, contractor is charged with maintaining those standards throughout the press run (within QATAP tolerances when applicable) and with discarding all makeready sheets that preceded approval. When a press sheet inspection is required, it will be specified on the individual print order. See GPO Publication 315.3 (Guidelines for Contractors Holding Press Sheet Inspections) issued August 2002. Note: A press sheet inspection is for the purpose of setting specific standards that are to be maintained throughout the entire run. It does not constitute a prior approval of the entire run.

Press sheets must contain control bars for each color of ink on the sheet. Control bars must be placed parallel to the press's ink rollers. The control bars (such as, BRUNNER, GATF, GRETAG, or RIT)must show areas consisting of 3/16 x 3/16" minimum solid color patches; tint patches of 25, 50, and 75%; dot gain scale; and gray balance patches for process color (if applicable). These areas must be repeated across the entire press sheet.

MARGINS: Margins will be as indicated on the print order or furnished copy. Bleeds all sides.

BINDING: Saddle-wire stitch in two places and trim three sides. Each product must contain complete 4-page signature after trimming. Single leaves connected with a lip (i.e., binding stub) to left or right side of stitches will not be allowed. Single copies/self mailers to remain flat (DO NOT FOLD).

PACKING: Bulk Shipments: Pack in shipping containers.

Mailed Shipments: Single copies must be mailed as self-mailers.

All self-mailers (approximately 1,500 to 6,000 copies per order) will require clear wafer seal(s) to be placed on the 8-1/2" dimension. Wafer seals must comply with U.S. Postal Services regulations for mailing.

LABELING AND MARKING: Reproduce shipping container label from furnished repro, fill in appropriate blanks and attach to shipping containers.

On the back of each copy mailed singly as a self-mailer, either: create and affix labels output from a Government-furnished disk(s), or image name and address directly onto product utilizing information furnished on a Government-furnished disk(s).

DEPARTMENTAL RANDOM COPIES (BLUE LABEL): All orders must be divided into equal sublots in accordance with the chart below. A random copy must be selected from each sublot. Do not choose copies from the same general area in each sublot. The contractor will be required to execute a statement furnished by GPO certifying that copies were selected as directed. The random copies constitute a part of the total quantity ordered, and no additional charge will be allowed.

50 randomly selected copies must be packed separately and identified by a special Government-furnished blue label, affixed to each affected container. The container and its contents shall be recorded separately on all shipping documents and sent to the address indicated under "SCHEDULE".

A copy of the PRINT ORDER/SPECIFICATION and a signed Government-furnished certificate of selection, must be included.

QUALITY ASSURANCE RANDOM COPIES: In addition to the Departmental Random Copies (Blue Label), the contractor may be required to submit quality assurance random copies to test for compliance against the specifications. The print order will indicate the number required, if any. When ordered, the contractor must divide the entire order into equal sublots and select a copy from a different general area of each sublot. The contractor will be required to execute a statement furnished by GPO certifying that copies were selected as directed. Copies will be paid for at the running rate offered in the contractor's bid and their cost will not be a consideration for award.

Business Reply Mail labels will be furnished for mailing the quality assurance random copies. The copies are to be mailed at the same time as the first scheduled shipment. A copy of the print order must be included.

A U.S. Postal Service approved Certificate of Mailing, identified by Program, Jacket and Print Order numbers, must be furnished with billing as evidence of mailing.

DISTRIBUTION: Deliver f.o.b. destination approximately 664 copies to approximately 5 addresses within the commercial zone of Washington, DC. Inside delivery is required.

Mail f.o.b. contractor's city:

Orders will require the mailing of approximately 1,500 to 6,000 copies as self-mailers.

It is anticipated at this time that two to ten copies will go to 637 destinations and 26 to 50 copies to 9 destinations, and 1 address (Sheperdstown, WV) receives 120 copies that ship via traceable means.

Complete addresses and quantities will be furnished with the print orders.

All mailing shall be made at the Standard Presort rate.

The contractor is cautioned that "Permit Imprint" indicia may be used only for the purpose of mailing material produced under this contract.

All copies mailed must conform to the appropriate regulations in the U.S. Postal Service manuals for "Domestic Mail" or "International Mail" as applicable.

Certificate of Conformance: When using Permit Imprint Mail the contractor must complete GPO Form 712 - Certificate of Conformance (Rev. 1-88), supplied by GPO and the appropriate mailing statement or statements, supplied by USPS.

Upon completion of each order, all furnished material, films, one sample copy, and a copy of the Certificate of Mailing (for Quality Assurance Random copies) must be returned to the address listed under "Schedule", Attn: Pete Maccini.

All expenses incidental to returning materials and furnishing sample copies must be borne by the contractor.

SCHEDULE: Adherence to this schedule must be maintained. Contractor must not start production of any job prior to receipt of the individual print order (GPO Form 2511).

No definite schedule for pickup of material can be predetermined.

If revised proofs are required, contractor must submit them within 1 workday(s) and pickup edited proofs within 1 workday(s).

The ship/deliver date indicated on the print order is the date products ordered for delivery f.o.b. destination must be delivered to the destinations specified and mailing completed.

The contractor must notify the GPO of the date and time the press sheet, inspection can be performed. In order for proper arrangements to be made, notification must be given at least 1 workday prior to the inspection. Notify the U.S. Government Printing Office, Agency Publishing Service, Agency Strategic Team 4, Washington, DC 20401, or telephone (202) 512-0310. Telephone calls will only be accepted between the hours of 8:00 am and 2:00 pm, prevailing eastern time. Note: See contract clauses, paragraph 14(e)(1), Inspections and Tests of GPO Contract Terms (GPO Publication 310.2, effective December 1, 1987 (Rev. 6-01)). When supplies are not ready at the time specified by the contractor for inspection, the Contracting Officer may charge to the contractor the additional cost of the inspection.

Unscheduled material such as shipping documents, receipts or instructions, delivery lists, labels, etc., will be furnished with each order or shortly thereafter. In the event such information is not received in due time, the contractor will not be relieved of any responsibility in meeting the shipping schedule because of failure to request such information.

Upon completion of each order, the contractor is to notify the Government Printing Office of the date of shipment (or delivery, if applicable). Call (202) 512-0516 or 0517; callers outside the Washington, DC area may call toll free 1-800-424-9470 or 9471.

SECTION 3.- DETERMINATION OF AWARD

SECTION 4.- SCHEDULE OF PRICES

Bids offered are f.o.b. destination within the commercial zone of Washington, DC and f.o.b. contractor's city for all other shipments.

Prices must include the cost of all required materials and operations for each item listed in accordance with these specifications.

Bidder must make an entry in each of the spaces provided. Bids submitted with any obliteration, revision, or alteration of the order and manner of submitting bids, may be declared nonresponsive.

An entry of (NC) (No Charge) shall be entered if bidder intends to furnish individual items at no charge to the Government.

Bids submitted with NB (No Bid) or blank spaces for an item may be declared nonresponsive.

The Contracting Officer reserves the right to reject any offer that contains prices for individual items of production (whether or not such items are included in the Determination of Award) that are inconsistent or unrealistic in regard to other prices in the same offer of to GPO prices for the same operation if such action would be in the best interest of the Government.

A charge will be allowed for each page, whether printed or blank.

All vouchers submitted to the GPO shall be based on the most economical method of production.

Fractional parts of 1,000 will be prorated at the per 1,000 rate.
