The Office of Data Analysis and Information Systems and the National Training Center are pleased to announce a mandatory 3-day New Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS) and FMCSA Website Workshop. It will be held at the Crystal Gateway Marriott in Arlington, Virginia, from August 20-22. The training is mandatory for:

- FMCSA Transportation Assistants,
- FMCSA Program Managers involved in MCMIS,
- State government personnel from PRISM States who use MCMIS,
- MCSAP State government personnel who are assigning USDOT Numbers to Intrastate carriers, and
- Other MCSAP State personnel who use MCMIS.

The August 20-22 session can only accommodate 150 attendees. At this time, we suggest that you limit attendance to two staff members from your Division office and one attendee from your State. Instructions for making travel arrangements are attached.

My office is working with the National Training Center to offer two training sessions in the first quarter of FY 2003, to be held at the Center in Arlington, Virginia, for those who cannot attend the August session. We will send out additional information in the near future.

The Motor Carrier Management Information System has been running in the same computer environment since it was created in 1988. The time has come to bring MCMIS into the 21st Century by moving MCMIS to an enhanced web-based computer environment as of September 3, 2002. New MCMIS will offer many new features and will require training for all users. The workshop will introduce participants to the new, web-enabled New MCMIS and will require hands-on-training on the new and updated features. In addition, sessions will be offered on the FMCSA websites to provide a broad overview of internal and public websites that collectively support FMCSA safety data.
