We believe that the increase in these costs are due to the increased demand or growth and the anti-competitive trade policies of the Chinese government. Accordingly, we support the "Petition For The Imposition Of Monitoring And Controls With Respect To Exports From The United States Of Copper Scrap And Copper Alloy Scrap" filed by the Copper and Brass Fabricators Council and the Non-Ferrous Founders' Society on this past April 7th.

We therefore respectfully request that the Commerce Department accept this petition and initiate the investigations necessary to determine whether the remedies requested in that petition are justified.
